## TOP STORYLINES

This is the sixth year that the Zurich Classic of New Orleans will be played with the two-man team format, which was introduced in 2017 (canceled in 2020). The teams will play Four-ball in the first and third rounds, and Foursomes in the second and final rounds. Xander Schauffele and Patrick Cantlay will defend their title after winning in wire-to-wire fashion in 2022.

Five of the top six players on the leaderboard at last week's RBC Heritage are in the field, including champion Matt Fitzpatrick, who is competing with his brother, Alex. The younger Fitzpatrick is making his second career start on TOUR and first since the 2022 Valspar Championship (MC). The defending champions finished third (Cantlay) and fourth (Schauffele), while the two players that tied for fifth are also making the trip to New Orleans: Hayden Buckley is paired with 2022 Valero Texas Open champion J.J. Spaun and Sahith Theegala is teaming up with 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Player of the Year Justin Suh.

Cantlay and Schauffele are the second team made up of two of the top five players in the Official World Golf Ranking since the format was introduced in 2017. Schauffele returned to the top five in the OWGR (No. 5) with his fourth-place finish at the RBC Heritage for the first time since October 5, 2022. Collin Morikawa and Viktor Hovland are the only other pair of top-five players to team up at the Zurich Classic; in 2022, Morikawa was No. 2 and Hovland No. 5, and the team finished T29.

Cantlay and Schauffele are one of four pairs of teammates that also competed in the 2022 Presidents Cup (one pair of players from the International Team, three for the United States). In the only match between two teams that are in the field this week at the Zurich Classic, Si Woo Kim and Tom Kim defeated Schauffele and Cantlay, 1-up, in Four-ball on Saturday (Tom Kim clinched the match with a birdie at No. 18).

Both captains for the 2023 Ryder Cup are in the field and are competing with one of their vice captains. For the United States, Zach Johnson is paired with Steve Stricker, who was the captain for the United States at the 2017 Presidents Cup and 2020 Ryder Cup (won both). Europe captain Luke Donald is competing with Eduardo Molinari.

14 teams are made up of players from the same country (outside the United States). Countries with multiple teams include England (3), South Korea (3), Australia (2) and Canada (2).

## **ADDITIONAL STORYLINES**

The only team made up of two players that have won on TOUR this season is Si Woo Kim/Tom Kim. Tom Kim won the Shriners Children's Open in the fall portion of the season, while Si Woo Kim won the Sony Open in Hawaii in the second tournament of the calendar year.

The only team made up of two major champions is John Daly/David Duval. Daly, a two-time major champion, won the 1991 PGA Championship and The Open Championship in 1995. Duval won The Open six years later in 2001. Daly and Duval also make up the oldest team in the field, while Harry Hall/Akshay Bhatia make up the youngest (ages calculated as of Thursday, April 20).
