Today – Any areas of shallow fog should burn off quickly after sunrise. Dry conditions are forecast throughout the day under mostly sunny skies. Southeasterly winds will become breezy after 9am, becoming sustained at 10-17 mph with gusts between 18-22 mph.

Extended forecast – A complex of showers and thunderstorms is expected to develop out ahead of a cold front on Friday. A few showers and thunderstorms may pop up out ahead of the complex after 8am Friday morning prior to widespread rain and thunderstorms reaching TPC Louisiana around 10am. A few thunderstorm wind gusts of 30-40 mph could occur as this complex arrives. The thunderstorm complex will take around 4 hours to move through before a lull likely settles in after 2pm and continues through 8pm. Additional scattered showers and a few thunderstorms will then become possible between 8pm and midnight as the cold front sweeps through. Dry conditions return after midnight and will continue through the weekend. Breezy northnortheasterly winds are forecast behind the cold front on Saturday – strongest in the morning and early afternoon with gusts near 22 mph. Dry and breezy Sunday with northeasterly winds turning easterly at noon.
