The tournament is held annually in St. Louis, MO, and features legends of the game such as Bernhard Langer, David Toms, John Daly, Retief Goosen, Justin Leonard, Tom Lehman, Colin Montgomerie, Ernie Els, Darren Clarke, and Olazábal, José María to name a few.

The Ascension Charity Classic proudly stands as a premier golf tournament on PGA TOUR Champions, but this event is much more than a golf tournament. The events and activities associated with the Ascension Charity Classic provide an all-inclusive, entertaining atmosphere. The beautiful views of historic Norwood Hills Country Club serve as a backdrop for world-class golf and provide the perfect venue to mingle with friends, family and business leaders while watching some of golf's greatest champions. The third-year event's primary mission is to benefit local charities in North County and throughout St. Louis. All three rounds of the Ascension Charity Classic will be televised internationally by Golf Channel.

NORWOOD HILLS COUNTRY CLUB

THE THIRD PLAYING OF THE ASCENSION CHARITY CLASSIC PRESENTED BY EMERSON

Volunteers, fans, and the PGA TOUR Champions professionals are excited to build on the success of the first two years of the tournament that have ushered in the return of professional golf to St. Louis and Norwood Hills Country Club.

One of the best fields on PGA TOUR Champions, this elite roster of 78 players collectively represent 218 PGA TOUR Champions victories, including 17 senior major championship winners.

The field also contains 22 PGA TOUR major championship wins and five World Golf Hall of Fame members, including Ernie Els, Bernhard Langer, Collin Montgomerie, José María Olazábal, and Retief Goosen. Twenty of the top-25 players in the Charles Schwab Cup standings are represented, including three of the top-5: Stephen Ames (No.2), Bernard Langer (No.3), and Ascension Charity Classic inaugural champion David Toms (4).

The world-class field also features the current Senior Open Championship winner Alex Cejka, plus PGA TOUR Champions rookies Boo Weekley, Tim O'Neal, Justin Leonard, Notah Begay III, and Jason Bohn. Fan favorite John Daly also joins the field as do Ascension Ambassadors Billy Andrade, Jay Delsing, Tom Lehman, Paul Stankowski, and Jay Williamson. O'Neal and Leonard are also Ascension Ambassadors competing in this year's tournament.

One of the primary objectives of the Ascension Charity Classic presented by Emerson is a genuine, philanthropic vision. To that end, the tournament has established a legacy of giving in North St. Louis County and beyond and in 2022 the second playing of the Ascension Charity Classic raised more than \$1 million for charitable organizations in North St. Louis County and beyond. The total included \$225,000 for each of the tournament's primary beneficiaries, Marygrove, Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater St. Louis (BGCSTL), and Urban League of Metropolitan St. Louis (ULMSTL).

Additionally, First Tee of Greater St. Louis and PGA REACH Gateway—the two benefiting charities of the tournament's Legends Charity Challenge presented by World Wide Technology—each were presented with a donation as a result of the 2022 exhibition match. First Tee received \$32,500 thanks to the team of Lee Trevino, Hale Irwin, and Ryan O'Reilly, with PGA REACH Gateway taking home \$30,000 with the help of Nancy Lopez, Craig Berube, and Ozzie Smith.

The tournament's newest charity fundraiser, the RSM Putting Challenge, was held on Tuesday of tournament week last year and raised \$130,000 for charity. The event featured 11 three-person teams—each consisting of one PGA TOUR Champions or Advocates Professional Golf Association (APGA) Tour professional, one corporate sponsor participant, and a player associated with the charity—competing in a nine-hole putting match on Norwood Hills's main putting green.

In 2021 the Ascension Charity Classic donated more than \$800,000 in support of North St. Louis County communities. And in 2020—despite not hosting a tournament due to the pandemic—the tournament donated \$225,000, bringing the official PGA TOUR Champions event's total charitable donations since the inception to more than \$2 million.

RSM Charity Putting Challenge – Tuesday, September 5th at 4:30-6 p.m. (Norwood Hills Putting Green)

The RSM Putting Challenge, which debuted at last year's tournament, benefits nine local St. Louis charitable organizations.

Each charitable organization will be selected by a participating sponsor and receive an investment of \$10,000 on behalf of their supporting benefactor.

The 11 RSM Charity Putting Challenge teams will each consist of one PGA TOUR Champions professional, one charity representative, and one junior/youth player associated with the charity competitor. The teams will compete in a scramble-format putting match over a specially designed nine-hole miniature golf course on the putting green at Norwood Hills. The team with the lowest gross score will take home an additional \$7,000 for that team's charity. The second-place charity will receive a \$4,500 bonus, and third place will take home an extra \$2,500.

- Each team will be assigned a starting hole with all teams completing the nine-hole course. The teams with the three lowest gross scores win.
- The RSM Putting Challenge is designed to provide additional support for more charities through the Ascension Charity Classic presented by Emerson.

Area charities with teams participating are: Marygrove, Good Shepherd Children & Family Services, Operation Food Search, Family Forward, Saint Louis Counseling, Little Bit Foundation, and Lafayette Industries, Lolly's Place, ETA Boule' Foundation, Ronald McDonald House of St. Louis, and Our Little Haven.

The Legends Charity Challenge will take place on Saturday, September 9—following the final pairing of the Ascension Charity Classic's second round (3:45 p.m. estimated start time)—and will begin on Hole No. 10 at Norwood Hills Country Club.

Interview local businesses about the impact of Ascension Charity Classic, perhaps focusing on some of the local restaurants that host players and their families during the week.
- Highlight how Ascension Charity Classic presented by Emerson is being leveraged to promote North County and St. Louis.

For security purposes, you consent to the reasonable inspection of your person and property before entering the tournament, which may include metal detection. No standalone photo or video cameras (outside of mobile devices) on competition days (allowed practice days only), coolers, ladders, signs, firearms, explosive devices, etc. will be permitted onto the tournament grounds. Mobile devices are permitted to the extent they are on silent and used in accordance with this license and the posted Mobile Device Policy.

GOLF ETIQUETTE

All cell phones and pagers must be put on silent. Remain quiet and stand still when the players are about to hit the ball. For your own safety, stay behind the gallery ropes and obey the Officials and Marshals.

Spectators will be removed immediately without warning for:

Refusal to obey quiet signs or signals
Distracting or embarrassing a player
Making rude, vulgar or other inappropriate comments or gestures toward a player
Booing or cheering at inappropriate times

Items not allowed on course include (but are not limited to):

Weapons

Large bags (small purses are allowed)
Cameras or video cameras (permitted Monday-Thursday)
Radios, TVs, signs, banners or ladders
Outside food and beverage
