Things to Know

- The Ascension Charity Classic 18-hole tournament record (62) and 54-hole tournament record (194) was established by 2023 winner **Steve Flesch**; the tournament low 36-hole score (130) was also posted this week by **Kevin Sutherland** and **Y.E. Yang**
- Flesch matches his low 18-hole score on PGA TOUR Champions, shooting 62 for the third time in 416 rounds
- Kevin Sutherland posts his first and only bogey of the week at his 49th hole (No. 13)
- Y.E. Yang has finished runner-up (2022) and T3 (2023) in two appearances at the Ascension Charity Championship

Steve Flesch - 66-66-62—194 (-19)

- Four-time PGA TOUR winner captures his fourth PGA TOUR Champions title in his 139th start: 2018 Mitsubishi
 Electric Classic, 2022 Mitsubishi Electric Classic, 2022 Pure Insurance Championship, 2023 Ascension Charity
 Classic
- Moves from No. 37 to No. 21 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Opens the final round with seven consecutive 3s on his scorecard en route to a 9-under 62, the 18-hole tournament record
- Equals his low round on PGA TOUR Champions: 62, twice, most recently 2020 Charles Schwab Series at Ozarks National in Branson, Missouri
- 194 (-19) marks the 54-hole tournament record (previous record: 199, Padraig Harrington, 2022)
- Final-round 62 comes after previous final-round scores of 72 in both 2021 (T23) and 2022 (T24) at the Ascension Charity Classic
- Caddie this week is son, Griffin, who caddied for Fred Couples when he shot 60 in the final round en route to victory at the 2022 SAS Championship

Additional Notes

• **Kevin Sutherland** makes his first and only bogey of the week at his 49th hole (No. 13) before closing with birdies on Nos. 17 and 18 to finish solo second, his first top-five finish this season; all nine rounds in three starts at Norwood Hills Country Club have been under par (T9/2021, T16/2022, 2nd/2023); is 29-under par in three starts at this event

- **Brett Quigley** matches his best finish this season and posts his fourth top-five result this season (T3/Trophy Hassan II, 4th/Mitsubishi Electric Classic, T5/DICK'S Sporting Goods Open, T4/U.S. Senior Open, T3/Ascension Charity Classic)
- In search of his first PGA TOUR Champions title, **Y. E. Yang** shoots his lowest 54-hole total (200) for the third time on PGA TOUR Champions, and the second time at this event; now has three top-five finishes in 45 starts, with two of the three coming at this event (2nd/2022 Ascension Charity Classic, 4th/2023 Senior PGA Championship, T3/Ascension Charity Classic); his six rounds at Norwood Hills Country Club: 68-66-64-66-70
- Following a T9 in his last start at the Shaw Charity Classic, World Golf Hall of Fame member **Colin Montgomerie** (T5/-12) posts top-10s in back-to-back starts for the second time this season (T3/Insperity Invitational, T10/Mitsubishi Electric Classic)
- 2021 Ascension Charity Classic champion **David Toms** finishes T5 at 12-under 201; now has finishes of Win-T16-T5 at this event and is 29-under with all nine rounds in the 60s at Norwood Hills Country Club
- **Ken Duke** (T5/-12) posts nine pars on his last nine holes to shoot a final-round 70 for the third consecutive time at the Ascension Charity Classic
- With a final-round 66 to finish T10 at 10-under, World Golf Hall of Fame member Bernhard Langer notches his 220th top-10 on PGA TOUR Champions and moves to No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings, surpassing Stephen Ames (T45/-2)
- First-round co-leader and Ascension ambassador **Tim O'Neal** finishes T8 at 11-under and eight strokes back for his third top-10 finish this season and best of his PGA TOUR Champions career
- Tom Lehman withdrew before the final round
