Things to Know

- Seeking his record-tying 45th victory on PGA TOUR Champions, defending Chubb Classic champion **Bernhard Langer** holds a one-stroke lead entering the final round. A quartet of players, including 2022 PGA TOUR Champions Player of the Year **Steven Alker**, share second place.

Bernhard Langer, 64-70 – 134 (-10)

- The World Golf Hall of Fame member seeks his record-tying 45th win on PGA TOUR Champions (319th start)
 - His 44 wins rank second all-time behind Hale Irwin
- At 65 years, 5 months, 23 days, he would extend his record as the oldest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history with a win on Sunday
 - Currently holds the top 3 spots on the oldest winners list
- Seeks his fifth win at the Chubb Classic after claiming titles in 2011, 2013, 2016 and 2022 (15th start)
 - With a fifth win at the Chubb Classic, he would record the second-most wins by any player at any tournament in PGA TOUR Champions history
 - Record: 6 wins (Hale Irwin/Turtle Bay Championship)
 - The Chubb Classic is one of three tournaments Langer has won four times, his most at any event (Insperity Invitational, The Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex)
- The defending champion's position on the leaderboard in his last five rounds at the Chubb Classic is 1st-1st-1st-T1-1st
 - Dating back to the second round of the 2019 Chubb Classic, Langer has been inside the top 5 on the leaderboard after 12 of the last 13 rounds at this event
- With a win on Sunday, Langer would become the third back-to-back winner in Chubb Classic history, joining Lee Trevino (1990-1991) and Mike Hill (1993-1994)
- A win on Sunday would be his 10th victory in the state of Florida on PGA TOUR Champions

- It would be his 16th consecutive season with a win on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Note: It would be his 17th consecutive year with a win, having won during both years of the 2020-21 wrap-around season
- This is his 45th time leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
 - Is 28-for-44 converting those into victories
- Will play in the last group of the final round for the fifth time since the start of the 2022 season (first time in 2023)
 - Is 2-for-4 converting those into victories
- With a top-10 finish, he would notch his 212th top-10 on PGA TOUR Champions, passing Hale Irwin (211) for the most in Champions Tour history

Other Notes

- Making his 700th combined start (PGA TOUR Champions/PGA TOUR), first-round co-leader **Paul Goydos** carded 1-under 71 and sits T2 at 9-under. The 58-year-old seeks his sixth win on PGA TOUR Champions (189th start). With a victory on Sunday, he would snap a winless streak of 2,023 days (or 5 years, 6 months, 13 days), dating back to the 2017 3M Championship.
- 2022 Charles Schwab Cup winner **Steven Alker** carded the round of the day with 7-under 65. He sits T2 at 9-under. The 51-year-old seeks his sixth win on PGA TOUR Champions (35th start).
- **Jerry Kelly** posted bogey-free 6-under 66 and sits T2 at 9-under. The 56-year-old seeks his 12th win on PGA TOUR Champions (131st start), which would move him into T24 on the all-time wins list. It would be his sixth consecutive season with a win.
- **Dicky Pride** shot 2-under 70 and sits T2 at 9-under. The 53-year-old seeks his second win on PGA TOUR Champions (55th start).
- Seeking his record-tying fourth consecutive win on PGA TOUR Champions, 2021 Chubb Classic champion **Steve Stricker** sits T6 at 8-under after shooting 3-under 69. With a victory on Sunday, he would join Chi Chi Rodriguez (1987) as the only players in Champions Tour history with four consecutive wins.
- World Golf Hall of Fame member and two-time Chubb Classic champion (2010, 2017) **Fred Couples** carded 3-under 69 and sits T6.
- Making his 2023 season debut, 2022 PGA TOUR Champions Rookie of the Year **Padraig Harrington** eagled the 18th hole to card 2-under 70 and sits T8 at 7-under, along with **Olin Browne** and World Golf Hall of Fame members **Ernie Els** and **Retief Goosen**.
- **Fred Funk** (dizziness) withdrew during the second round.
