#### Things to Know

- 65-year-old **Bernhard Langer** earned his 45th victory on PGA TOUR Champions to tie the all-time wins record with Hale Irwin. During Sunday's final round, Langer birdied four of his final five holes to shoot his age (65) and collected a three-stroke triumph over Charles Schwab Cup leader **Steve Stricker** and reigning Rookie of the Year **Padraig Harrington**.

#### Bernhard Langer, 64-70-65 – 199 (-17)

- Earned his 45th victory on PGA TOUR Champions to tie the all-time wins record with Hale Irwin (319 starts)
- Extended his record as the oldest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history (65 years, 5 months, 23 days)
  - Now holds the top 4 spots on the oldest winners list
    - No. 2: 2022 TimberTech Championship (65 years, 2 months, 10 days)
    - No. 3: 2022 Chubb Classic (64 years, 5 months, 24 days)
    - No. 4: 2021 Dominion Energy Charity Classic (64 years, 1 month, 27 days)
- Shot his age or better for the eighth time on PGA TOUR Champions (998 rounds)
  - It was his second time shooting his age or better this week (64/First Round)
- Earned his fifth victory at the Chubb Classic (2011, 2013, 2016, 2022, 2023), his most wins at any event on PGA TOUR Champions (15 starts)
  - It is the second-most wins by any player at any tournament in PGA TOUR Champions history, behind only Hale Irwin's six wins at the Turtle Bay Championship
- Becomes the third back-to-back winner in Chubb Classic history, joining Lee Trevino (1990-1991) and Mike Hill (1993-1994)
- His position on the leaderboard in his last six rounds at the Chubb Classic were 1st-1st-1st-T1-1st-1st
  - Dating back to the second round of the 2019 Chubb Classic, Langer has been inside the top 5 on the leaderboard after 13 of the last 14 rounds at this event
- Earned his 10th victory in the state of Florida on PGA TOUR Champions
- Has won 14.1% of his starts on PGA TOUR Champions (45 wins in 319 starts)
  - Ranks second among players who have at least 10 wins, behind only Steve Stricker (24.5%)
- This is Langer's 16th consecutive season with a win on PGA TOUR Champions

- It is his 17th consecutive year with a win, having won during both years of the 2020-21 wrap-around season
- This is his 12th win since turning 60 years old, most in PGA TOUR Champions history
- Improved to 29-for-45 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
- Notched his 212th top-10 on PGA TOUR Champions to pass Hale Irwin (211) for the most in Champions Tour history

#### Other Notes

- In his bid for a record-tying fourth consecutive win on PGA TOUR Champions, 2021 Chubb Classic champion **Steve Stricker** closed with 6-under 66 to finish T2 at 14-under. He moves to No. 1 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Making his 2023 season debut, 2022 PGA TOUR Champions Rookie of the Year **Padraig Harrington** eagled the 18th hole to shoot 7-under 65 and finished T2 at 14-under.
- **Dicky Pride**, who made a final-round hole-in-one on No. 10 with a 4-iron from 213 yards, bogeyed his last two holes to card 4-under 68 and finish T4 at 13-under, along with **Jerry Kelly**.
- Making his sixth start on PGA TOUR Champions, rookie **Justin Leonard** closed with bogey-free 66 to finish T6 at 11-under, along with **David Toms**.
- 2022 Charles Schwab Cup winner **Steven Alker** and two-time Chubb Classic champion (2010, 2017) **Fred Couples** finished T8 at 10-under.
- **Alex Cejka** posted the round of the day with 9-under 63 to move from T43 to T10 on the leaderboard.
- Making his 700th combined start (PGA TOUR Champions/PGA TOUR), first-round co-leader **Paul Goydos** finished T13 at 8-under.
- **Chris DiMarco** made a hole-in-one on Hole No. 4 with a 5-iron from 185 yards.
