Things to Know

- After opening the 2023 Dominion Energy Charity Classic with a bogey-free 7-under 65, good for the 18-hole lead, **Harrison Frazar** bettered a second-round 1-under 71 with a closing 3-under 69 to force sudden death with Australia's **Richard Green**; on the first hole of sudden death, the par-5 18th, Frazar's birdie was good for his first career win on PGA TOUR Champions

Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs

- This week's Dominion Energy Charity Classic marked the first of the three Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs events and featured the top-72 available in the standings. The top-54 now move on to the TimberTech Championship (November 3-5) in Boca Raton, Florida, while only the top 36 from the TimberTech Championship will advance to the season-ending Charles Schwab Cup Championship in Phoenix (November 9-12).

Harrison Frazar (1st/-11)

- Following a bogey-free 7-under 65 in round one to take the 18-hole lead, made 10 straight pars in the final round before birdies at Nos. 11, 16 and 18 resulted in a 3-under 69 and sudden death with Australia's Richard Green; on the first extra hole, the par-5 18th, his birdie was enough for his first career win on PGA TOUR Champions
- With the win, Dallas, Texas native jumps to No. 21 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Wins his first PGA TOUR Champions title in his 41st start at the age of 52 years, 2 months, 24 days
- In his only previous start at the Dominion Energy Charity Classic, he finished T39 in 2022 (2-under 214)
- The win marks his third top-5 finish of the season (T3/Kaulig Companies Championship, T3/The Ally Challenge)
- Best finish prior to this week is 2nd/2022 Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS
- Now has one PGA TOUR win (2011 FedEx St. Jude Classic), one Korn Ferry Tour win (1997 South Carolina Classic) and one PGA TOUR Champions crown (2023 Dominion Energy Charity Classic)

Richard Green (2nd/-11)

- In search of his first career win on PGA TOUR Champions, rookie and 2023 PGA TOUR Champions Qualifying Tournament Medalist closed with a 3-under 69 before falling short of Harrison Frazar's birdie on the first hole of sudden death, the par-5 18th
- With the runner-up finish, moves to No. 17 in the Charles Schwab Cup
- The finish marks his best in 27 PGA TOUR Champions starts, supplanting a T3 from the 2023 Trophy Hassan II
- The runner-up finish comes after top-15 finishes in his two most recent starts before this week: Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS (T15) and SAS Championship (T11)
- Dating to the Boeing Classic in mid-August, has now posted scores of par-or-better in 25 of his last 27 rounds on PGA TOUR Champions

Other Notes

- In his first start since winning the Constellation FURYK & FRIENDS two weeks ago, 36-hole leader **Brett Quigley (3rd/-10)** birdied two of this last three holes in the final round to close with a 1-under 71 and miss the playoff by a stroke
- 2016 Dominion Energy Charity Classic winner **Scott McCarron (T4/-9)** birdied his first two and last two holes of the final round to close with a 5-under 67 in his bid to become the event's second repeat winner (previously World Golf Hall of Fame member **Bernhard Langer** in 2017 and 2021)
- Looking to improve on a solo-second finish from his only other Dominion Energy Charity Classic in 2020, Canada's **Mike Weir (T4/-9)** used birdies on his first three holes to finish with a 4-under 67
- Defending champion **Steven Alker** finished T25 at 1-under 215
