## Things to Know

- 36-hole co-leader and 2021 champion Stephen Ames closed with 5 -under 67 to capture his third win of the season and moves up to No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- Co-runner-up Steve Stricker was the only player in the field to play all 54 holes without a bogey or worse.
- Defending champion Jerry Kelly shot bogey-free 65 to finish T2.
- Reigning Q-School Final Stage medalist Richard Green carded the low round of the day with 9 -under 63 to move from T54 to T19 on the leaderboard.

Stephen Ames, 66-66-67-199 (-17)

- Earned his third win of the season on PGA TOUR Champions (10 starts)
- Matched Steve Stricker (3) for the most wins among all players in 2023
- Ames also won the Trophy Hassan II (Feb. 9-11) and Mitsubishi Electric Classic (May 5-7)
- The 59 -year-old earned his fifth win on PGA TOUR Champions ( 184 starts)
- Becomes the third multi-time winner of the Principal Charity Classic $(2021,2023)$
- Previous instances: Jay Haas $(2007,2008,2012)$ and Bob Gilder $(2002,2011)$
- Moves up to No. 2 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings
- Captured the eighth victory by a player from Canada on PGA TOUR Champions
- Improved to 4 -for-8 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
- Has converted each of the last three instances after starting 1-for-5
- Improved to 3 -for- 3 when playing in the last group of the final round this season


## Steve Stricker, 64-68-68-200 (-16)

- Seeking his third consecutive win, he earned his seventh top-2 finish this season (10 starts)
- Was the only player in the field to play all 54 holes without a bogey or worse
- Last player to play a 54-hole event on PGA TOUR Champions without a bogey or worse: Steven Alker (2022 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai)
- Note: Steven Alker played the first 65 holes of the 2022 Charles Schwab Cup Championship (72hole event) without a bogey or worse.
- Remains No. 1 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings with a lead of $\$ 1,137,896$ over No. 2 Stephen Ames
- Stricker has held the No. 1 spot for nine of the 12 weeks this season
- Recorded his 52nd consecutive round of par or better on PGA TOUR Champions, extending his all-time record, which dates back to last season
- Has shot par or better in all 32 rounds in 2023, the longest streak to start a season in Champions Tour history
- This is his 14th consecutive top-10 finish on PGA TOUR Champions, dating back to last season
- Has finished in the top 10 in all 10 starts in 2023


## Other Notes

- Defending champion Jerry Kelly carded 7-under 65 to finish T2 at 16 -under. He moves up to No. 10 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings after earning his fourth top- 5 of the season (nine starts).
- Rod Pampling and Tim Petrovic each finished T4 at 15-under. Playing in the second-to-last group, Petrovic was tied for the lead at 16 -under as he played No. 18 but made bogey on the hole.
- 36-hole co-leader Tim Herron closed with even-par 72 to finish T9. It was his first top-10 of the season (10 starts).
- Seeking his record-setting 46th win on PGA TOUR Champions, Bernhard Langer carded 1-under 71 to finish T26 at 8-under.
- 2018 champion Tom Lehman (T53) made a hole-in-one on the par-3 14th with a 4-iron from 195 yards.
