Things to Know

- In his 100th career start on PGA TOUR Champions, **Ken Duke** birdies the final hole in the final round of the Shaw Charity Classic presented by Rogers to capture his first title.
- Now 11 times a runner-up, 18- and 36-hole outright leader **Tim Petrovic** closes with a 1-under 69 to finish one stroke back.
- On only three of 10 occasions has a 36-hole leader/co-leader converted for the win at the Shaw Charity Classic (Rocco Mediate/2013, Scott McCarron/2016, Doug Barron/2020).
- **Thongchai Jaidee** uses nine final-round birdies to shoot his PGA TOUR Champions career-low score of 62 and tie the low round of the week.
- In his bid to join Scott McCarron as players to successfully defend a Shaw Charity Classic title (2017-18), **Jerry Kelly** was 5-under through five holes (par-birdie-eagle-birdie-birdie) before closing with a 5-under 65 to finish T9 at 9-under 201.

Ken Duke (66-64-66—196/-14)

- Beginning the final round two strokes off the lead at 10-under 130, in his 100th PGA TOUR Champions start, Ken Duke birdied the 54th hole to finish with a 4-under 66 and secure his first career PGA TOUR Champions title.
- The victory marks Duke's third top-10 finish in as many starts at the Shaw Charity Classic (T8/2019, T9/2020, 1st/2023)
- Duke claims his first PGA TOUR Champions title at the age of 54 years, 6 months, 22 days.
- Duke, an Arkansas native, began his professional career playing PGA TOUR Canada from 1996-2002.
- Duke's Shaw Charity Classic win marks his 16th top-10 finish and second of the season (T9/Insperity Invitational).
- Duke's lone PGA TOUR victory came at the 2013 Travelers Championship in Cromwell, Connecticut.
- Duke becomes the 20th different player to win on the Korn Ferry Tour, PGA TOUR and PGA TOUR Champions.

Additional Notes

- **Tim Petrovic**, who led outright by two shots after each of the first two rounds on the strength of a 62-66 start, closed with a 1-under 69 to claim his 11th runner-up finish on PGA TOUR Champions; remains in search of his

first victory on PGA TOUR Champions; drops to 0-for-3 when attempting to convert for the win when beginning the final round with at least a share of the lead.

- Beginning the final round seven shots off the lead at 5-under 135, Thailand's **Thongchai Jaidee** birdied four of his first five holes in the final round, and nine total, to close with his PGA TOUR Champions career-low of 8-under 62 to finish T2 at 13-under 197; the 53-year-old finished T16 in his first Shaw Charity Classic last year; this week's finish marks his second top-10 of the season (T5/DICK'S Sporting Goods Open)
- Highlighted by an eagle-3 at the par-5 18th to cap off his week, **Darren Clarke** closed with a 7-under 63 to finish T4 at 11-under 199; in two previous Shaw Charity Classic starts, finished T28 in 2018 and T43 in 2019; his most recent of five top-10 finishes before this week was a T5 with Thongchai Jaidee (and Brett Quigley) at the DICK'S Sporting Goods Open.
- Following his career-low 8-under 62 in round two, newly minted 60-year-old **Scott Dunlap** closed with a 3-under 67 to finish T4 and secure his fourth top-10 finish in his eighth Shaw Charity Classic (T3/2015, T6/2016, T3/2017, T4/2023)
