Things to Know

- 36-hole leader **Padraig Harrington** birdied six of his first seven holes and never looked back in a seven-stroke win at the TimberTech Championship.

Padraig Harrington, 67-66-64 – 197 (-16)

Charles Schwab Cup standings – Start: 9th / Current: 3rd

- The 52-year-old earned his sixth win on PGA TOUR Champions (33 starts)
- Earned his second win of the 2023 season (12 starts)
 - Previous win: DICK’S Sporting Goods Open (June 23-25)
- Becomes the fifth multi-time winner this season on PGA TOUR Champions, joining Steve Stricker (6), Stephen Ames (4), David Toms (2) and Bernhard Langer (2)
- Matched the TimberTech Championship 54-hole scoring record (197 strokes)
 - Previous instance: Bernhard Langer (2019)
 - Note: The Old Course at Broken Sound previously played as a par 72, so the scoring record (to par) was not matched
- This is his low 54-hole score in a 54-hole event on PGA TOUR Champions (197)
 - Note: Shot 192 in the first 54 holes of the 2022 Charles Schwab Cup Championship (72-hole event)
- Matched the largest margin of victory of the 2023 season on PGA TOUR Champions (7 strokes)
 - Previous instance: Stephen Ames (Boeing Classic)
 - Set the TimberTech Championship record for largest margin of victory
- Moves up to No. 3 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings after starting the week No. 9
 - In 2022, finished No. 2 in the standings en route to winning PGA TOUR Champions Rookie of the Year
- In five appearances in Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs events (including last year), he has finished T3-4th-1st-T7-1st
- Improved to 4-for-5 when leading/co-leading entering the final round on PGA TOUR Champions
- Earned the 16th victory by a player from Ireland on PGA TOUR Champions

Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs Implications

The Top 36 players in the Charles Schwab Cup standings have qualified for the Charles Schwab Cup Championship.

Charlie Wi (T2) was the lone player to move into the Top 36 after the starting the week outside of the number to advance to next week.

Other Notes

- Three-time TimberTech Championship winner (2010, 2019, 2022) **Bernhard Langer** finished runner-up at 9-under. After playing his first 10 holes in 4-under, Langer played his final eight holes in 3-over, including a double bogey on No. 17. This is Langer's ninth top-3 at the TimberTech Championship (15 starts).
- **Charlie Wi** matched the low round of the day with bogey-free 64. He finished T2 at 9-under to move from 54th to 34th in the Charles Schwab Cup standings and earned a spot into next week's field.
- **Shane Bertsch** and World Golf Hall of Fame member **Ernie Els** each finished T4 at 8-under.
 - Bertsch bogeyed the 18th hole to finish his season No. 39 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
 - This is Els' 14th top-10 of the season (22 starts) as he remains No. 5 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- **Marco Dawson**, **Ken Duke** and **David Toms** each finished T6 at 7-under.
- TimberTech ambassador **Brett Quigley** (T39) made a hole-in-one on No. 14 with a 7-iron from 182 yards.
