## Costilla, Blanchet share lead at Roberto De Vicenzo event

BERAZATEGUI, Argentina—Both César Costilla and Chandler Blanchet shot 3-under 68s Saturday during the third round of the Roberto De Vicenzo Memorial 100 Years and that left the Argentine and the U.S. player deadlocked with 18 holes to play. Costilla made an 18th-hole bogey, while Blanchet was bogey-free, leaving the two players tied at 12-under and a stroke ahead of four players as they enter the final round of the fifth PGA TOUR Latinoamérica tournament of the season. New Zealand's Charlie Hillier and Argentines Leandro Marelli, Rafael Echenique and Andrés Romero are all tied for third.

Besides his late miscue, Costilla's only other bogey at Ranelagh Golf Club came early in his round, at the par-4 second hole. He offset his miscues with three birdies and an eagle at the par-5 11th, where he hit a drive and then a 3-iron approach shot to nine feet and sunk the putt.

"My caddie helped me read the green and it went right down the middle of the hole," said the 43-yearold veteran from Tucumán.

"I am really happy, I've been playing really good golf, and I've felt very comfortable with the putter all week. It's something I've been working on, and although I finished with that bogey on the 18th, I know my game is in a good place," Costilla explained.

In 2009, Costilla won the Argentine Open at Nordelta Golf Club in Buenos Aires. There to present him with the trophy 14 years ago was Roberto De Vicenzo. Costilla thought about that Saturday afternoon.

"It would be incredible to win a tournament that bears [De Vicenzo's] name. I would love to have that trophy in my home's showcase," Costilla said.

After recording nothing but pars on his opening nine Saturday, the native of Gainesville, Florida, saw a few putts fall in what was another bogey-free round. Blanchet had a six-birdie, no-bogey opening-round performance.

"Three birdies and no bogeys is always good. A clean card for the second time this week," Blanchet said, noting his trio of birdie putts were of the sweat-free variety. He rolled them in from three feet (No. 11), three feet (No. 13) and nine inches (No. 16). He just missed a fourth, on the 18th to the dismay of the large crowd.

"I hit the ball really well today, and I rolled it pretty well. A lot of [the putts] scared the hole, but I didn't make many," he added.

Of the three Argentines within shouting distance of the lead, Marelli's week has been the biggest adventure. After opening with a tournament-best 62 Thursday, he shot a disappointing 74 in the second round to fall into a tie for eighth. Saturday, Marelli was back to his opening-round tricks, posting a 5-under 66, without a bogey on his card.

**Did you know César Costilla** is playing in his 60th career PGA TOUR Latinoamérica tournament? Ironically, his career-best finish is a tie for third at the 2015 Roberto De Vicenzo Punta del Este Open Copa NEC in Maldonado, Uruguay. That week, Costilla tied with Mexico's Rodolfo Cazaubón, three strokes behind winner Lanto Griffin.

The Zurich Argentina Swing ends this week at the Roberto De Vicenzo Memorial 100 Years, the fourth of four events in Argentina. There are nine players in this week's field still with a mathematical chance of winning the U.S. \$10,000 bonus. Sweden's **Linus Lilliedahl** holds a 114-point lead over No. 2 **Cristóbal** del Solar, but del Solar is playing on the Korn Ferry Tour this week. The next-closest player to Lilliedahl is **Jake McCrory**, 135 points behind Lilliedahl.

**Zack Fischer** and **Cristobal del Solar** both held solo 54-hole leads and converted those advantages into victory, Fischer at the VISA Argentina Open and del Solar at the Neuquén Argentina Classic. At the Scotia Wealth Management Chile Open, **Matt Ryan** shared the third-round lead with **Conner Godsey** and prevailed on Sunday. **Jake McCrory** followed Ryan's lead and did the same thing, breaking free from a 54-hole lead with **Myles Creighton** and winning the Termas de Rio Hondo Invitational.

**Matt Ryan** and **Jake McCrory** are the only two 2022-23 winners playing this week. Heading into Sunday, Ryan is tied for 13th, while McCrory is tied for 24th.

These eight players all have three rounds in the 60s this week: César Costilla, Chandler Blanchet, Charlie Hillier, Rafael Echenique, Raul Pereda, Tommy Cocha, Andrés Romero, and Max Sekulic.

Second-round leader **Davis Shore** stayed in neutral during third round. Following a 64-68 start that left him at 10-under when the day began, Shore fired an even-par 71, including a short birdie miss on the 18th that dropped him into a tie for seventh but only two strokes behind the leaders.

**Austin Squires** took a while to start his season, but so far so good. Last week at the Termas de Rio Hondo Invitational, the former University of Cincinnati stalwart made his Tour debut and posted four under-par rounds, all in the 60s, on his way to a tie for fifth. Squires moved his under-par streak to seven consecutive rounds, with his 2-under 69 Saturday, matching his opening-round score. He also added a 1under 70 Friday, leaving him at 5-under overall and tied for 18th. Squires is tied for 36th in the Totalplay Cup.

With three consecutive 70s to begin this week, **Austin Hitt** has stretched his under-par streak to eight consecutive rounds. After shooting an opening-round 75 in Chile in December, Hitt shot a 1-under 71 the next day but ultimately missed the cut. At last week's Termas de Rio Hondo Invitational, Hitt posted scores of 70-69-67-69 to tie for 12th. With 18 holes to play this week, he's tied for 38th.

**Kaylor Steger** and **Jack Sparrow** both helped themselves considerably Saturday, firing 5-under 66s to move up 32 scoreboard positions with 18 holes remaining. They both began the day tied for 45th. Steger had seven birdies and two bogeys, while Sparrow was bogey-free.

There were 39 Argentines playing this week, and 14 made the cut. Leading the way is **César Costilla**, tied for the 54-hole lead, while **Andrés Romero**, **Rafael Echenique** and **Leandro Marelli** are only a stroke behind. Here is where the others sit through 54 holes.
