THIS WEEK ON TOUR

- Following a two-week break in the schedule, the Korn Ferry Tour resumes this week in Kansas City, Missouri at the AdventHealth Championship, the 10th tournament of the 26-event season.
- This marks the 14th ever playing of the event and the fifth time held at Blue Hills Country Club.
- Three past winners of the AdventHealth Championship are in the field this week:
 Trevor Cone (2022), Zecheng Dou (2017) and Jamie Lovemark (2013).
- Harry Higgs, who grew up in Overland Park, Kansas, will be making his fifth ever start in this event. Higgs made his first PGA TOUR-sanctioned start at the 2009 AdventHealth Championship at the age of 17 years old. His best finish in Kansas City came in 2019 when he finished T2.
- Reigning champion Grayson Murray won last year's event by one stroke over and went on to finish the season ranked seventh on the season-long points list. In 11 PGA TOUR starts this season, Murray has two top-10 finishes, including his second career TOUR win which came at the 2024 Sony Open in Hawaii. He currently sits 35th in the FedExCup standings.
- Five of the seven players who finished T5 or higher at the 2023 AdventHealth Championship went on to earn PGA TOUR cards at season's end, including Grayson Murray (winner), Rico Hoey (T2), Wilson Furr (T2), Alejandro Tosti (4th) and Parker Coody (T5).

2024 KEY STORYLINES

- Each winner in the first eight events of the season were first-time winners on the Korn Ferry Tour, tying the second-longest streak of first-time winners to open a season in Korn Ferry Tour history. The 2022 season also opened with eight consecutive first-time winners, while the 2002 season opened with 10 consecutive first-time winners.
- Tim Widing is the only player this season with two victories after back-to-back wins at the LECOM Suncoast Classic and the Veritex Bank Championship. Widing, who sits No. 1 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List and will be playing in the PGA Championship this week, earned his second win of the season by recording the lowest 72-hole score relative to par in Tour history (31-under 253).
- South African Aldrich Potgieter, the youngest Korn Ferry Tour member this season, won The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club in January and became the youngest winner on either the Korn Ferry Tour or PGA TOUR since 1931 (19 years, 4 months, and 11 days). Two weeks later at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, Potgieter carded a second-round 11-under 59 and became the youngest player to record a sub-60 round in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event.
- Also at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, 30-year-old Chilean
 Cristobal Del Solar carded the lowest 18-hole score ever recorded in a PGA TOUR sanctioned event with a 13-under 57. Del Solar topped the previous record of 58,
 previously achieved by Jim Furyk (PGA TOUR's 2016 Travelers Championship) and
 Stephen Jaeger (Korn Ferry Tour's 2016 Ellie Mae Classic at TPC Stonebrae).
- Mason Andersen's victory at the 117th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro
 earned him an exemption for the 2024 Open Championship at Royal Troon. The
 Visa Argentina Open, which became a Korn Ferry Tour event this season, annually
 awards an exemption for The Open Championship via its partnership with the R&A.

Korn Ferry Tour Finals refers to the final four events of the 26-event season, where players will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning a Finals event, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race. The total purse for each of the first 22 events is \$1 million (\$180,000 to the winner) and increases to \$1.5 million for each of the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events.

TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

- Field includes 53 Korn Ferry Tour winners -- including seven of the eight winners from this season -- with 76 total wins, led by four-time winner Kevin Stadler.
- Field includes 18 PGA TOUR winners with 36 total victories, led by five-time winner Jonathan Byrd.
- Five players in this week's field are in the top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking: Mason Andersen (No. 148), Steven Fisk (No. 183), Trent Phillips (No. 194), Taylor Dickson (No. 198) and Isaiah Salinda (No. 200).
- Ross Steelman is a native of Columbia, Missouri, approximately a one-hour drive from Kansas
 City. Steelman, currently No. 24 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List, has four top-25 finishes in
 eight starts this season, with his best being a solo-third in the season-opening event.
- Sponsor exemption and Leawood, Kansas native Chase Hanna will be making his 10th career
 Korn Ferry Tour start this week, his first since the 2019 season. As an amatuer, Hanna was the
 2013 Kansas City Golf Association Junior Player of the Year, and he went on to play collegiately
 at the University of Kansas and was the 2017 Big 12 Conference individual golf champion.
- Mason Andersen (No. 2 on the points list entering the week) and Isaiah Salinda (No. 8) both
 finished inside the top 10 in this event last season. Andersen placed T5 and Salinda recorded
 the first top-10 of his Korn Ferry Tour career with a T9.
- Charlie Hillier, a native of Te Puke, New Zealand, is playing as a sponsor exemption this week.
 Hillier played on the collegiate level at the University of Kansas from 2015-19 and now resides in Overland Park, Kansas. In six starts this season, Hillier has one made cut (T64 at The Bahamas Great Exuma Classic at Sandals Emerald Bay).
