



- Fourth-year member who originally joined the Tour in 2020 via a T13 finish at Final Stage of the 2019 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament
- In his 89th career start on the Tour this week, earns his second win, 10th top-10 finish and 16th top-25
- Turned professional in 2015
- Played four seasons collegiately at Winthrop University (2011-15) where he won one individual title
- Plays from Gastonia, North Carolina

### Quotables

**Taylor Dickson** on if he was looking at the leaderboard throughout the day... “Yeah, absolutely. I kind of knew where I was and just tried to keep the pedal down. I mean, like I said, Sam's an unbelievable player. I knew he wasn't going to go away so I just kept trying to make birdies and see where it put me and luckily it was enough.”

**Dickson** on his emotions after winning... “Couldn't be happier. It was fun to get one with my caddie, Lee. He wasn't there in Chile, so it was really fun to get a win with him. He told me it's been coming for a while and I'm just pumped really.”

**Dickson** on his mindset entering today... “Just play my best, same thing I did in Chile. Just play as good as I can, see what happens. Didn't really expect to be in it at the end there. I mean, Sam's an unbelievable player, but just golf and couldn't be more excited.”

### Additional final-round notes

- **William Mouw** (T2/-18) finishes the week with rounds of 66-66-65-65 and clinches the best finish of his Korn Ferry Tour career (previous best: T5/2024 Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank)
  - A second-year member on the Tour, Mouw earned conditional Korn Ferry Tour membership by finishing No. 6 in the 2023 PGA TOUR University Ranking following four collegiate seasons at Pepperdine University (2019-23)
- Wichita native and Crestview Country Club member **Sam Stevens** (T2/-18) cards a final-round even-par 70, including bogeys on each of his last two holes (Nos. 17-18), and settles for runner-up in his first Korn Ferry Tour start of the season
  - Stevens held a three-shot lead entering the day after opening the week with rounds of 66-63-63
  - Stevens earned his first PGA TOUR card at the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Finals and has remained on the TOUR since; in 17 starts on TOUR this season, Stevens has six top-25 finishes and sits 94th in the 2024 FedExCup Standings
- Following a third-round 62 that tied his career low, **Kevin Roy** (T4/-16) cards a final-round 3-under 67 and records his third top-10 and fifth finish of T15 or better this season
- **Kevin Velo** (T4/-16) finishes inside the top five for the second consecutive event after also placing T4 at last week's BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX
  - Velo earns his fourth straight top-25 finish and the seventh of the season in 14 starts
- **Nelson Ledesma** (T6/-15) cards a final-round 5-under 65 and records his second top-10 finish of the season after placing 3rd two weeks ago at the UNC Health Championship presented by STITCH
- Following a final-round bogey-free 2-under 68, **Davis Chatfield** (T6/-15) notches the best finish of his Korn Ferry Tour career (38 total starts from 2023-24)
- **Patrick Cover** (T6/-15) sat in solo second after 54 holes and finished T6 after a final-round even-par 70, his second top-10 finish of the season (T2/LECOM Suncoast Classic)
- Rookie **Marcus Byrd** (9th/-14), in his eighth career start on the Tour, claims his second consecutive top-10 finish (T9 at last week's BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX)
- In his second start of the season, open qualifier **Chase Johnson** (T12/-12) finishes the week with a bogey-free 5-under 65 to finish T12, earning a start in next week's Compliance Solutions Championship (via top-25 finish)
- **Dawson Armstrong** (T17/-11), who carded a season-low 63 in the second round, finishes inside the top 25 for the first time this season to earn a start in next week's Compliance Solutions Championship
