WHAT TO KNOW THIS WEEK

- The Korn Ferry Tour heads to Savannah, Georgia for the seventh playing of the Club Car Championship at The Landings Golf & Athletic Club.
- All four rounds of competition will air live on Golf Channel (all times ET)
 - Thursday, April 4 - 10:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.
 - Friday, April 5 - 10:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.
 - Saturday, April 6 - 3:30 - 6 p.m.
 - Sunday, April 7 - 2:30 - 6 p.m.
- Three past champions are in the field this week: **T.J. Vogel** (2022), **Evan Harmeling** (2020) and **Dan McCarthy** (2019).
- Fifteen players in the field played collegiately in the state of Georgia:
 - Georgia Tech (**Shunyat Hak, Paul Haley II, Connor Howe, Chris Petefish, Seth Reeves, Ollie Schniederjans, Ross Steelman, Richy Werenski**)
 - Georgia (**Erik Compton, Joey Garber, Trent Phillips, Spencer Ralston**)
 - Georgia Southern (**Ben Carr, Steven Fisk, Mason Williams**)
- Additional players with local/regional ties to the area include: **Dawson Armstrong** (born in Valdosta, Georgia), **Brian Campbell** (Bluffton, South Carolina resident), **Emilio Gonzalez** (St. Simons Island, Georgia resident), **Billy Kennerly** (plays from Alpharetta, Georgia), **Bryson Nimmer** (plays from Okatie, South Carolina), and **Paul Peterson** (plays from St. Simons Island, Georgia).
- Columbus, Georgia native **Ben Carr** will make his Korn Ferry Tour debut as a sponsor exemption this week. A former No. 1 junior golfer in the state of Georgia, Carr played collegiately at Georgia Southern where he was the 2022-23 Sun Belt Golfer of the Year and notably finished runner-up in the 2022 U.S. Amateur.
- Five players who finished T8 or better in this event last year went on to earn PGA TOUR cards at season's end: David Skinnis (Winner), Tom Whitney (T2), Max Greyserman (T6), Jacob Bridgeman (T6), and Nicholas Lindheim (T8).
- Mason Andersen** sits atop the points list through the first six events of the season after logging three top-10 finishes, highlighted by his first career title at last month's 117 Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro. With the win in Argentina, Andersen earned an exemption for the 2024 Open Championship at Royal Troon.

2024 KEY STORYLINES

- All six players to win an event this season are first-time winners on the Korn Ferry Tour: **Jeremy Paul, Aldrich Potgieter, Isaiah Salinda, Kevin Velo, Mason Andersen** and **Taylor Dickson**.
- South African **Aldrich Potgieter**, the youngest Korn Ferry Tour member this season, won The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club in January and became the [youngest winner on either the Korn Ferry Tour or PGA TOUR since 1931](#) (19 years, 4 months, and 11 days). Two weeks later at the Astar Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, Potgieter recorded a second-round 11-under 59 to become the [youngest player to record a sub-60 round](#) in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event.
- Also at the Astar Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, 30-year-old Chilean **Cristobal Del Solar** carded the [lowest 18-hole score ever recorded in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event](#) with a 13-under 57. Del Solar topped the previous record of 58, previously achieved by Jim Furyk (PGA TOUR's 2016 Travelers Championship) and Stephen Jaeger (Korn Ferry Tour's 2016 Ellie Mae Classic).

Korn Ferry Tour Finals refers to the final four events of the 26-event season where players will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning a Finals events, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race. The total purse for each of the first 22 events is \$1 million (\$180,000 to the winner) and increases to \$1.5 million for each of the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events.

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

- Each player ranked inside the top 50 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List is in the field this week.
- Reigning champion David Skinnis has posted two top-10 finishes on the PGA TOUR in 2024, including a T7 finish at last week's Texas Children's Houston Open. Skinnis currently sits 89th in the FedExCup standings.
- Sam Burns, who won the inaugural playing in 2018 as a rookie, earned his first PGA TOUR card in 2018 and has remained on TOUR since. Burns has five PGA TOUR titles in his career and 32 top-10 finishes in 141 starts on TOUR. He was a member of the victorious United States team at the 2022 Presidents Cup and also on the U.S. team at the 2023 Ryder Cup.
- Adam Svensson won the 2021 Club Car Championship at The Landings Golf & Athletic Club, edging out Max McGreevy on the second hole of a sudden death playoff. Svensson has one PGA TOUR win in his career which came at the 2022 RSM Classic.
- Field includes 53 past Korn Ferry Tour winners with 75 total wins, led by **Kevin Stadler** with four.
- Field includes 21 past PGA TOUR winners with 38 total victories, led by **Ben Crane** with five.
- Field includes all six winners from this season: **Jeremy Paul, Aldrich Potgieter, Isaiah Salinda, Kevin Velo, Mason Andersen** and **Taylor Dickson**.
- The highest ranked player in the field is **Mason Andersen** (OWGR No. 165).
