THIS WEEK ON TOUR

- The Korn Ferry Tour heads to Norman, Oklahoma for the second playing of the Compliance Solutions Championship, the 15th event of the Tour's 26-event season.
- Jimmie Austin OU Golf Club, home of the University of Oklahoma men's and women's golf teams, will play host to this week's tournament for the second time.
- Last week, **Taylor Dickson** became the third two-time winner on Tour this season with his second victory coming at the Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefiting KU Wichita Pediatrics. With the win, Dickson moves up to No. 3 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List. Dickson captured his first career victory earlier this season at the Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank.
- BYU Freshman **Cooper Jones** will be making his first ever start in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event this week after earning a sponsor exemption through the PGA TOUR's Pathway to Progression by winning the inaugural Bridgestone Collegiate Invitational at Silverado Country Club in Napa, California.
- Arkansas Razorback **John Dally II**, son of five-time PGA TOUR winner John Daly, will make his first ever start on the Korn Ferry Tour via a sponsor exemption. Daly II won the 2021 PNC Championship alongside his father, and they earned runner-up honors in 2021 and 2018.
- Reigning champion Jimmy Stanger earned his first career victory in this event last year and went on to finish No. 15 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour points list to earn his first PGA TOUR card. This season on TOUR, he's recorded three top-25 finishes and one top 10, coming in the form of a T3 finish at the Puerto Rico Open.

2024 KEY STORYLINES

- **Tim Widing** sits No. 1 on the points list and was the first Korn Ferry Tour member this season to achieve #TOURBound status and secure PGA TOUR membership for the 2025 season. A 26-year-old from Jonkoping, Sweden, Widing (pronounced VEE-ding) won back-to-back starts in April, earning his first Korn Ferry Tour win via a three-way playoff at the 2024 LECOM Suncoast Classic, and following it with a record-setting victory at the 2024 Veritex Bank Championship a week later.
- **Harry Higgs**, No. 2 on the points list, became the first player in Korn Ferry Tour history to win back-to-back tournaments in a playoff with wins at the AdventHealth Championship and the Visit Knoxville Open.
- With last week's victory at the Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefiting KU Wichita Pediatrics, **Taylor Dickson** joined Higgs and Widing as the only players with multiple wins this season. Each of the two-time winners are now in the hunt for the Three-Victory Promotion, which would earn an immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR for the 2024 season.
- South African **Aldrich Potgieter**, the youngest Korn Ferry Tour member this season, won The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club in January and became the [youngest winner on either the Korn Ferry Tour or PGA TOUR since 1931](#) (19 years, 4 months, and 11 days). Two weeks later at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, Potgieter carded a second-round 11-under 59 and became the [youngest player to record a sub-60 round](#) in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event.
- Also at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, 30-year-old Chilean **Cristobal Del Solar** carded the [lowest 18-hole score ever recorded in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event](#) with a 13-under 57. Del Solar topped the previous record of 58, previously achieved by Jim Furyk (PGA TOUR's 2016 Travelers Championship) and Stephen Jaeger (Korn Ferry Tour's 2016 Ellie Mae Classic at TPC Stonebrae).

Korn Ferry Tour Finals refers to the final four events of the 26-event season, where players will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning a Finals event, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race. The total purse for each of the first 22 events is \$1 million (\$180,000 to the winner) and increases to \$1.5 million for each of the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events.

TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

- Field includes 48 Korn Ferry Tour winners -- including all 11 winners from this season -- with 65 total wins, led by four-time winner **Kevin Stadler**.
- Field includes 10 PGA TOUR winners with 15 total wins, led by **Kyle Stanley, Robert Streb, Russell Knox, Steven Bowditch** and **Fabian Gómez** with two wins each.
- Including champion Jimmy Stanger, seven players who finished T11 or better at last year's Compliance Solutions Championship went on to earn their PGA TOUR cards at the conclusion of the 2023 season: Rafael Campos (2nd), Nicholas Lindheim (3rd), Alejandro Tosti (T8), Jake Knapp (T8), Ben Silverman (T11) and Rico Hoey (T11).
- 14 Korn Ferry Tour members competed in last week's U.S. Open at Pinehurst Resort & Country Club (Course No. 2) in Pinehurst, North Carolina with six making the cut: **Isaiah Salinda** (T32), **Frankie Capan III** (T41), **Tim Widing** (T41), **Brian Campbell** (T56), **Sam Bennett** (T56) and **Jackson Suber** (T73rd).
- Nine players in this week's field have ties to the state of Oklahoma: **Quade Cummins** (Weatherford native), **Rhein Gibson** (Edmond resident), **Brandon Jelley** (Tulsa native), **Andre Metzger** (Ada native), **Logan McAllister** (Oklahoma City resident), **Max McGreevy** (Edmond native), **Tag Ridings** (Oklahoma City native), **Robert Streb** (Chickasa native) and **Braden Thornberry** (Germantown native).
- Seven current and former Oklahoma Sooners will compete at their home course this week: **Quade Cummins, Grant Hirschman, Ben Lorenz, Logan McAllister, Max McGreevy, Garrett Reband,** and **Patrick Welch**.
- Five other players in the field played collegiate golf in the state of Oklahoma:
