THIS WEEK ON TOUR

- The Korn Ferry Tour returns to Springfield, Missouri for the 18th event of the Tour's 26-event season, the Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Dr Pepper
- The Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Dr Pepper is one of four tournaments played every season since the Korn Ferry Tour's inaugural 1990 season, with this year marking the 35th playing of the event.
 - The other three events with such distinction are the Visit Knoxville Open, Blue Cross& Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics, and Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron.
 - Only the Price Cutter Charity Championship, Wichita Open, and Albertsons Boise Open are set to enter their 35th playing this year, as the Visit Knoxville Open was only contested once (2021) amid the 2020-21 combined season.
- Chilean Cristobal Del Solar became the fifth player to achieve #TOURBound status this season with a four-stroke victory at The Ascendant presented by Blue last week; the first win of his Korn Ferry Tour career. Del Solar's winning score of 22-under 266 broke the 72-hole tournament scoring record.
- Tim Widing and Taylor Dickson, two of the three two-time winners this season (Higgs is the other), are both seeking the Three-Victory Promotion, which would earn them an immediate promotion to the PGA TOUR.
- Reigning champion Pierceson Coody, who finished No. 6 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his first PGA TOUR card, recorded his best career result on TOUR last week with a T2 at the ISCO Championship; his second top-10 finish of the season.

2024 KEY STORYLINES

- 30-year-old Chilean Cristobal Del Solar became the fifth player to achieve #TOURBound status this season with a win at The Ascendant presented by Blue.
 Earlier in the season, Del Solar carded the <u>lowest 18-hole score ever recorded in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event</u> with a 13-under 57 at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard.
- Following a T4 finish at the Compliance Solutions Championship, Harry Higgs became the second player this year to be declared #TOURBound, securing his return to the PGA TOUR. The Dallas resident captured back-to-back victories at the AdventHealth Championship and Visit Knoxville Open
- Tim Widing (pronounced VEE-ding) won back-to-back starts in April (LECOM Suncoast Classic, Veritex Bank Championship) and became the first player to achieve #TOURBound status this season, but his two-plus months as the No. 1 player on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List ended after the Memorial Health Championship presented by LRS. Max McGreevy won the event and climbed to No. 2 on the Points List, while Steven Fisk finished solo second and rose to No. 1.
- Taylor Dickson became the third two-time winner on Tour this season with his win at the Blue Cross & Blue Shield of Kansas Wichita Open Benefitting KU Wichita Pediatrics. Dickson earned his first career Korn Ferry Tour victory earlier in the year at the Astara Chile Classic presented by Scotiabank.
- South African Aldrich Potgieter, the youngest Korn Ferry Tour member this season, won The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club in January and became the youngest winner on either the Korn Ferry Tour or PGA TOUR since 1931 (19 years, 4 months, and 11 days). Two weeks later at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, Potgieter carded a second-round 11-under 59 and became the youngest player to record a sub-60 round in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event.

Korn Ferry Tour Finals refers to the final four events of the 26-event season, where players will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning a Finals event, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race. The total purse for each of the first 22 events is \$1 million (\$180,000 to the winner) and increases to \$1.5 million for each of the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events.

TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

- Highland Springs Country Club has hosted every iteration of the Price Cutter Charity Championship presented by Dr Pepper.
- Field includes 51 Korn Ferry Tour winners -- including 11 winners from this season -- with 72 total victories, led by four-time winners Kevin Stadler.
- 10 players in this week's field are in the top 200 in the Official World Golf Rankings: Tim Widing (No. 117), Taylor Dickson (No. 130), Cristobal Del Solar (No. 146), Frankie Capan III (No. 162), Max McGreevy (No. 166), Brian Campbell (No. 176), Jackson Suber (No. 179), Ryan Gerard (No. 189), Peter Kuest (No. 190) and Alistair Docherty (No. 191).
- Field includes 11 PGA TOUR winners with 22 total wins, led by Jonathan Byrd with five career victories.
- Three past champions are in this week's field: David Kocher (2022), Max McGreevy (2020), and Dawie van der Walt (2015).
- Seven of the 12 players that finished T7 or higher at last year's Price Cutter Charity
 Championship presented by Dr Pepper, including reigning champion Pierceson Coody, earned
 their PGA TOUR cards with a top 30 finish on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List. Coody, Ben
 Silverman (T2), Chandler Phillips (T2), Parker Coody (T2), Adrien Dumont de Chassart (T7),
 Patrick Fishburn (T7), and Jake Knapp (T7).
