**Today** – Sunny skies this morning becoming a mix of sun and clouds later this afternoon. Largely expecting dry conditions this afternoon, but a stray vicinity shower or isolated weak thunderstorm cannot be entirely ruled out. North-northwesterly winds will increase to 15-20 mph after 11am-noon, along with gusts in the 20-25 mph range. The temperature is expected to eclipse the 100°F mark this afternoon.

**Extended forecast** – A ridge of high pressure will become centered over the Central Rockies this weekend. This ridge will bring with near-record highs forecast Saturday and Sunday. A few vicinity showers or isolated thunderstorms will be possible each afternoon, but this area of high pressure should work to suppress activity – keeping most precipitation well west of TPC Colorado and across the higher elevations of the Front Range. Anticipate light northwesterly or variable winds in the morning on Saturday with winds turning northnortheasterly for the afternoon. Sunday will see light northwesterly winds in the morning shift east-southeasterly in the afternoon. Any isolated showers or thunderstorms that develop nearby may produce outflow winds of 30-40 mph from a west or northwesterly direction.
