THIS WEEK ON TOUR

- The Korn Ferry Tour returns to Texas Rangers Golf Club in Arlington, Texas for the fourth playing of the Veritex Bank Championship.
- Tim Widing's victory at last week's LECOM Suncoast Classic vaulted him to No. 1 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, moving five points ahead of No. 2 Mason Andersen and six points ahead of No. 3 Steven Fisk. The No. 1 player on the Points List at season's end will earn fully exempt membership for the 2025 PGA TOUR season, as well as exemptions for the 2025 PLAYERS Championship and U.S. Open.
- Miles Russell, a 15-year-old amateur and the 2023 AJGA Rolex Junior Player of the Year, will make his second Korn Ferry Tour start following a T20 finish at last week's LECOM Suncoast Classic. Last Friday, at 15 years, 5 months, 18 days of age, Russell became the youngest player to make the cut in Korn Ferry Tour history. Two days later (15 years, 5 months, 20 days of age) he became the youngest player on record (i.e. since 1983) to record a top-25 on either the Korn Ferry Tour or PGA TOUR.
 - The only other player under the age of 18 to record a top-25 in a Korn Ferry Tour event is Si Woo Kim (T11/2013 Mid-Atlantic Championship/17 years, 11 months, 5 days).
 - Gipper Finau previously held the record for youngest player to make the cut in Korn Ferry Tour history (16 years, 20 days/2006 Utah Championship).
- Each of the last five Korn Ferry Tour events ended in a sudden-death playoff, marking the longest such streak in Korn Ferry Tour history. The previous record for consecutive events which ended in a playoff was four (2004, 2019).
- Reigning champion Spencer Levin, who has four made cuts in eight starts this
 season and stands No. 102 on the Points List, will attempt to become the second
 player in Korn Ferry Tour history to successfully defend a title. The only successful
 title defense in Korn Ferry Tour history occurred at the Veritex Bank Championship,
 as Tyson Alexander won back-to-back titles in 2021 and 2022.
 - » Levin won the 2023 Veritex Bank Championship after he gained entry to the field as an open qualifier; he became the 24th player in history -- and only the second since the start of 2017 -- to win as an open qualifier.

2024 KEY STORYLINES

- All eight winners this season are first-time winners on the Korn Ferry Tour, tying
 the second-longest streak of first-time winners to open a season in Korn Ferry Tour
 history. The 2022 season also opened with eight consecutive first-time winners,
 while the 2002 season opened with 10 consecutive first-time winners.
- South African Aldrich Potgieter, the youngest Korn Ferry Tour member this season, won The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club in January and became the youngest winner on either the Korn Ferry Tour or PGA TOUR since 1931 (19 years, 4 months, and 11 days). Two weeks later at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, Potgieter carded a second-round 11-under 59 and became the youngest player to record a sub-60 round in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event.
- Also at the Astara Golf Championship presented by Mastercard, 30-year-old Chilean
 Cristobal Del Solar carded the lowest 18-hole score ever recorded in a PGA TOUR sanctioned event with a 13-under 57. Del Solar topped the previous record of 58,
 previously achieved by Jim Furyk (PGA TOUR's 2016 Travelers Championship) and
 Stephen Jaeger (Korn Ferry Tour's 2016 Ellie Mae Classic at TPC Stonebrae).
- Mason Andersen's victory at the 117th Visa Argentina Open presented by Macro earned him an exemption for the 2024 Open Championship at Royal Troon. The Visa Argentina Open, which became a Korn Ferry Tour event this season, annually awards an exemption for The Open Championship via its partnership with the R&A.

Korn Ferry Tour Finals refers to the final four events of the 26-event season, where players will compete for increased purses and points (600 points for winning a Finals event, compared to 500 for winning one of the 22 preceding events) to determine the season-long points race. The total purse for each of the first 22 events is \$1 million (\$180,000 to the winner) and increases to \$1.5 million for each of the four Korn Ferry Tour Finals events.

TOURNAMENT STORYLINES

- Field includes 49 Korn Ferry Tour winners -- including seven of the eight winners from this season -- with 69 total wins, led by four-time winner Kevin Stadler.
- Field includes 13 PGA TOUR winners with 27 total victories, led by five-time winners Ben Crane and Mark Wilson.
- Four players in this week's field are in the top 200 of the Official World Golf Ranking: Mason Andersen (No. 152), Steven Fisk (No. 185), Tim Widing (No. 193), and Isaiah Salinda (No. 198).
- Five of the nine player who finished T7 or higher at the 2023 Veritex Bank Championship went on to earn PGA TOUR cards at season's end, including Jake Knapp, who won the 2024 Mexico Open at Vidanta on TOUR. The five players were: Patrick Fishburn (T3), Rico Hoey (T3), Tom Whitney (6th), Jacob Bridgeman (T7), and Knapp (T7).
- Numerous members in the field have ties to the state of Texas: Sam Bennett (Madisonville resident), Steven Bodwitch (Flower Mound resident), Cooper Dossey (Addison resident), Noah Goodwin (Dallas resident), Tanner Gore (El Paso native), Cole Hammer (Houston resident), sponsor exemption Caleb Hicks (Arlington native and resident), Kyle Jones (Grapevine resident), Sung Kang (Frisco resident), Walker Lee (Houston native and resident), sponsor exemption Callum McNeill (Hockley resident), Mitchell Meissner (San Antonio resident), Alvaro Ortiz (Dallas resident), Tag Ridings (Keller resident), Thomas Rosenmueller (Denton resident), Brian Stuard (Fort Worth resident), Dawie van der Walt (Kingwood resident), Kyle Westmoreland (Katy resident).
