#### **TOP STORYLINES**

The field: The Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard is the fourth of eight Signature Events during the 2024 PGA TOUR season. There are 69 players in the field, exempt via the following categories:

- 1. Top 50 in the 2022-23 FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List (48 of the 50 players are in the field)\*
- 2. Aon Next 10 (Matthieu Pavon, Jake Knapp, Ludvig Åberg, Austin Eckroat, Luke List, Erik van Rooyen, Grayson Murray, Christiaan Bezuidenhout, Will Zalatoris, Justin Thomas)
- 3. Aon Swing 5 (Sami Valimaki, Min Woo Lee, C.T. Pan, Stephan Jaeger, Justin Lower)
- 4. Current season tournament winners not exempt from a higher category (Nick Dunlap)
- 5. Sponsor exemptions (Nicolai Højgaard, Shane Lowry, Adam Scott, Webb Simpson)
- 6. Tournament host exemption Palmer Cup participant (David Ford)
- \*Tony Finau is the only eligible player who is not competing.

36-hole cut: The only Signature Events to feature a cut are the three player-hosted invitationals (The Genesis Invitational, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday). Cut rule: low 50 players (and ties) and any additional players within 10 strokes of the 36-hole lead.

2022 Arnold Palmer Invitational winner and World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler is making fourth start at the event (T15/2020, Won/2022, 2023/T4). Since the start of the 2021-22 season, Scheffler has 19 top-three finishes on TOUR, eight more than any other player in that span (second: 11/Rory McIlroy).

2018 winner and 24-time PGA TOUR winner Rory McIlroy is making his 10th consecutive start at the Arnold Palmer Invitational. The World No. 2 leads the field with six top-10s at the event and has finished worse than T13 just once

Austin Eckroat won last week's Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, earning his first PGA TOUR title in his 50th career start. With the victory, Eckroat moved from No. 94 to No. 17 in the FedExCup and qualified for the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard via the Aon Next 10. He is also eligible for each of the four remaining Signature Events after the Arnold Palmer Invitational.

Three rookies have won on TOUR through nine events this season, tying the total number of rookie winners on TOUR in 54 events during the 2022-23 season. The last time there were four or more rookie winners in a season was in 2018-19 (5). There are four rookies in the field, including all three rookie winners on TOUR this season, as they continue to compete for the Arnold Palmer Award as Rookie of the Year.

34 players in the field at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard competed last week at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, with six finishing T4 or better, including Cameron Young (T4). Since joining the PGA TOUR at the start of the 2021-22 season, Young is tied with Tommy Fleetwood with nine top-five finishes, the most of any player without a win in that span.

#### **ADDITIONAL STORYLINES**

The Arnold Palmer Award is given annually to the PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year and **Eric Cole** is the reigning recipient, who will make his second start in the event (MC/2023). Cole is one of 10 players to be named Rookie of the Year in this week's field.

**Kurt Kitayama** won the 2023 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, earning his first career PGA TOUR victory in his 50th career start on TOUR. With a win this week, the defending champion would join Loren Roberts (1994-95), Tiger Woods (2000-03, 2008-09, 2012-13), Matt Every (2014-15) as back-to-back winners of the Arnold Palmer Invitational and become the eighth multiple winner of the event, joining Tiger Woods (8), Jerry Heard (2), Gary Koch (2), Tom Kite (2), Loren Roberts (2), Ernie Els (2) and Matt Every (2).

Kitayama became the first player since Robert Gamez in 1990 to win in his Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard debut.

#### Six players will be making their tournament debut this week:

**Xander Schauffele** has made 40 consecutive cuts, the longest active streak on the PGA TOUR, with his last missed cut coming at the 2022 Masters Tournament.

**David Ford**, a junior at the University of North Carolina earned a sponsor exemption by winning the vote of his peers at the 2023 Palmer Cup. Since 2017, the winning team has voted for one individual to receive an exemption into the Arnold Palmer Invitational. Ford will be making his third PGA TOUR start and first of the season (T58/2023 Barbasol Championship, MC/2023 RSM Classic).

The Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard is the first of three PGA TOUR events that is part of The Open Qualifying Series (OQS) in 2024 where one spot will be available into the 152nd Open at Royal Troon. The top player, not otherwise exempt, that makes the cut at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard will earn an exemption. In the event of a tie for a qualifying place, the player with the higher ranking in the OWGR at the beginning of the week will earn the spot. The other two PGA TOUR events that are part of the OQS in 2024 are the RBC Canadian Open (three spots) at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (one spot).

#### **TOP STORYLINES**

The Puerto Rico Open winner will receive 300 FedExCup points, a two-year exemption on the PGA TOUR and an invitation to next week's PLAYERS Championship (if not previously eligible) and other select events.

Four players have earned their first PGA TOUR victory this season. There have been 10 first-time winners in tournament history, including 2023 winner **Nico Echavarria**, who will be the first defending champion to compete in the event since Martin Trainer in 2020.

At No. 68 in the Official World Golf Ranking, Scotland's **Robert MacIntyre** is the highest-ranked player in the field and will be making his tournament debut. MacIntyre, a first-year member, earned his TOUR card through the DP World Tour Top 10, and will be making his 36th start on TOUR (best: 2nd/2023 Genesis Scottish Open) and seventh of the season (best: T6/Mexico Open at Vidanta).

2019 runner-up **Daniel Berger** will make his second start at the Puerto Rico Open. Since returning from a back injury at the 2024 American Express, the four-time PGA TOUR winner has made two cuts in four starts (best: T28/WM Phoenix Open). Berger is exempt through 2024 via the tournament winners category.

Colombia's **Camilo Villegas** is making his third consecutive start and fifth total at the event. Villegas, who earned his fifth career PGA TOUR victory at the 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship, is the most recent TOUR winner of any player in the field.

Puerto Rico native and 2021 Olympian **Rafael Campos** will make his 15th appearance at the Puerto Rico Open, the most tournament starts of any player in the field. Campos returns to the PGA TOUR this season for the first time since 2020-21 after finishing No. 30 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List. In 58 TOUR starts, Campos owns five career top-10s, with three at the Puerto Rico Open (T8/2016, T10/2017, T3/2021).
