Second-Round Notes – Friday, March 8, 2024

Weather: Partly cloudy. High of 85. Wind SSE 7-14 mph. The start of round two was delayed for 15 minutes due to fog.

Cut: 58 professionals at 3-over 147 from a field of 68 professionals and one amateur (low 50 players and ties and any additional players within 10 strokes of the 36-hole lead; six players at T53 are 10 strokes back)

Second-Round Lead Notes

- Six 36-hole co-leaders is the most in Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard history (4/2010)
- Marks the most second-round co-leaders on the PGA TOUR since seven players shared the lead at the midway point of the 2011 Valero Texas Open
- Five of the six co-leaders have won major championships since 2019 (Russell Henley has not)

Scottie Scheffler (T1/-7)

- 12th career 36-hole lead/co-lead since joining the TOUR at the start of the 2019-20 season, five more than any other player in stroke-play events during that span (7: Sam Burns, Patrick Cantlay)
- Third 36-hole lead/co-lead this season; no one else has more than one
- 2-for-11 to date with the 36-hole lead/co-lead (wins: 2022 Masters Tournament, 2023 WM Phoenix Open)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (7.820)
- 2022 champion is making his fourth start at the event (T15/2020, Won/2022, T4/2023)

Brian Harman (T1/-7)

- Seventh career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-6 to date (win: 2023 Open Championship)
- Makes the cut for the fifth time in his 11th start at the Arnold Palmer Invitational, with a T13 in 2017 his best finish
- Seeks fourth TOUR win in his 350th start (2014 John Deere Classic, 2017 Wells Fargo Championship, 2023 Open Championship)
- Leads the field through two rounds in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (4.667)

Shane Lowry (T1/-7)

- Third career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 1-for-2 to date (T3/2019 RBC Heritage, Won/2019 Open Championship)
- Competing on a sponsor exemption; Nick Dunlap won on a sponsor exemption at The American Express in January, becoming the first to do so since Martin Laird at the 2020 Shriners Children's Open
- First time with back-to-back under-par rounds (66-71) in his sixth start at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard; made the cut for the first time in 2023 (67th)

Hideki Matsuyama (T1/-7)

• Fifth career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 2-for-4 to date (wins: 2016 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2021 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)

- Making his first start since winning the 2024 Genesis Invitational, the most recent Signature Event; last player to win in consecutive starts on TOUR: Viktor Hovland during the 2023 FedExCup Playoffs (2023 BMW Championship, 2023 TOUR Championship)
- Finished T6 in 2016 for his only top-10 finish in nine prior starts at the Arnold Palmer Invitational

Russell Henley (T1/-7)

- 10th career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; 2-for-9 to date (wins: 2013 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2022 World Wide Technology Championship)
- Finished T13 in 2022 for his best finish in seven prior starts at the Arnold Palmer Invitational
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (4.258)

Wyndham Clark (T1/-7)

- Second-round 66 is his first round in the 60s in 12 rounds at the Arnold Palmer Invitational; T34 in 2023 represents his best finish in three prior starts at the event
- Fourth career 36-hole lead/co-lead in stroke-play events on the PGA TOUR; 1-for-3 to date (win: 2023 Wells Fargo Championship); also held the 36-hole lead with teammate Beau Hossler before finishing third at the 2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans

Miscellaneous Notes

- Will Zalatoris (7th/-6) cards second-consecutive 3-under 69; has 14 under-par scores in his last 15 rounds on TOUR; finished T2 at The Genesis Invitational and got in this week via the Aon Next 10
- Stephan Jaeger (T8/-5) qualified for the event via the Aon Swing 5 (T4 in the standings); finished T3 at the Mexico Open at Vidanta, equaling his career-high result on the PGA TOUR (MC/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches); also finished T3 this season at the Farmers Insurance Open
- Kurt Kitayama misses the cut in attempt to become the first player to successfully defend at Bay Hill since Matt Every in 2015
