TOP STORYLINES

The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the fifth event of the 2024 PGA TOUR season and second Signature Event. There are 80 players in the field, exempt via the following categories:

- 1. Top 50 in the 2022-23 FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List (49 of the 50 players are in the field)
- 2. Aon Next 10 Nos. 51-60 in the FedExCup Fall and Eligibility Points List (all 10 players are in the field)
- 3. Top player not otherwise exempt from the 2023 Race to Dubai (Nicolai Høigaard)
- 4. Aon Swing 5 (Matthieu Payon, Grayson Murray, Christiaan Bezuidenhout, Keyin Yu, Stephan Jaeger)
- 5. Current season tournament winners not exempt from a higher category (Nick Dunlap)
- 6. Sponsor exemptions (Peter Malnati, Mayerick McNealy, Adam Scott, Webb Simpson)
- 7. PGA TOUR members in the top 30 in the Official World Golf Ranking (Justin Thomas)
- 8. Fill the field to 80 players* (Alex Noren, Thomas Detry, Mark Hubbard, Erik van Rooyen, Brandon Wu, Davis Riley, S.H. Kim, Keith Mitchell, Hayden Buckley)
- * the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the only Signature Event that has a set field size (due to the pro-am format); the field is filled to 80 using Nos. 61 and beyond in the 2022-23 FedExCup Fall and Eligibility Points List.

17 players in the field have not qualified for The Genesis Invitational. Although the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am does not count towards the Aon Swing 5, if one of those 17 players wins this week, he will be eligible for the six remaining Signature Events this season. The current Aon Swing 5 standings will carry over to next week's WM Phoenix Open.

The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the only Signature Event in 2024 that was not a designated event during the 2022-23 season. The tournament is now a limited-field (80 players), no-cut event played on two courses (Pebble Beach Golf Links and Spyglass Hill Golf Course), with the pro-am portion concluding on Friday.

Thursday-Friday Field split between Pebble Beach and Spyglass (pro-am) for the first and second rounds

Saturday-Sunday All 80 professionals at Pebble Beach

11 players in the field are making their tournament debut, including World No. 1 and reigning PGA TOUR Player of the Year Scottie Scheffler. Others: Ludvig Åberg, Nick Dunlap, Emiliano Grillo, Nicolai Højgaard, Tom Kim, Hideki Matsuyama, Taylor Montgomery, Collin Morikawa, Matthieu Pavon and Cameron Young, Højgaard is coming off a solo-second at last week's Farmers Insurance Open, his second career runner-up on TOUR and first since the 2023 Corales Puntacana Championship.

The last two PGA TOUR events have been won by players earning their first TOUR victory; rookies Nick Dunlap (The American Express) and Matthieu Pavon (Farmers Insurance Open). Dunlap is looking to become the first player to earn his first two wins in consecutive starts since Camilo Villegas in 2008 (BMW Championship, TOUR Championship), while Pavon would be the first player to earn his first two wins in consecutive events on the TOUR schedule since David Duval in 1997 (Michelob Championship at Kingsmill, Walt Disney World/Oldsmobile Classic).

38 of the 80 players in the field competed in the 2019 U.S. Open at Pebble Beach, with 24 making the cut. Four of the 38 finished in the top 10: 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am winner Justin Rose and Xander Schauffele finished T3 while Adam Scott finished T7 and Rory McIlroy finished T9. Viktor Hovland (T12) earned low amateur honors.

Three players in the field have competed in all four TOUR events so far this season; 2023 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year Eric Cole, 2022 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am winner Tom Hoge and Davis Riley.

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Defending champion **Justin Rose** collected his 11th PGA TOUR title at the 2023 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, becoming the first European player to win the event. Rose made a hole-in-one on No. 15 at Spyglass Hill Golf Course during the second round and became the first player since Webb Simpson at the 2020 WM Phoenix Open to make an ace and go on to win. With a win this week, Rose would become the first player to successfully defend his title at the event since Dustin Johnson in 2010.

Three-time FedExCup Champion and 24-time PGA TOUR winner **Rory McIlroy** is making his 239th start on the PGA TOUR and his second at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (MC/2018). McIlroy, who is making his season debut, has finished in the top 10 in each of his last 10 starts on the PGA TOUR, the longest streak of his career. The last time he finished outside the top 10 in a TOUR event was at the 2023 Wells Fargo Championship (T47).

Won Genesis Scottish Open T7 PGA Championship

15-time PGA TOUR winner **Justin Thomas** is the only player in the field that qualified via his position in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 26; PGA TOUR members in the top 30 qualify for Signature Events). Thomas is making his second start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and first since missing the cut in 2014 (qualified via a top-10 at the Farmers Insurance Open that year as a sponsor exemption). Thomas has finished in the top five in each of his last two PGA TOUR starts (5th/2023 Fortinet Championship, T3/The American Express) for the first time since winning the 2022 PGA Championship (T5/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson the week prior).

Stephan Jaeger, who held the 36- and 54-hole leads at last week's Farmers Insurance Open before finishing T3, has made 20 consecutive cuts, the fourth-longest active streak on the PGA TOUR. The only players with longer active streaks are in the top five of the Official World Golf Ranking.
