**PGA TOUR Statement**

The storm affecting the Monterey Peninsula throughout the day Sunday is forecast to continue into the early hours of Monday with very strong winds. Although conditions are forecast to improve through the morning Monday, after consultation with Monterey County emergency authorities, who have implemented a Shelter in Place order until early tomorrow morning for the greater Pebble Beach community, and out of an abundance of caution for the safety of all constituents, there will be no play on Monday. Therefore, in accordance with the PGA TOUR Regulations the tournament results will be final through the conclusion of 54 holes. – **PGA TOUR Rules Committee**

**Weather-Related Notes**

- Due to dangerous weather conditions, the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am has been reduced to 54 holes, with third-round leader Wyndham Clark earning his third PGA TOUR victory by one stroke over Ludvig Åberg.
- The AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am is the first 54-hole tournament on TOUR since the 2016 Zurich Classic of New Orleans; the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am was also shortened to 54 holes in 2009.

**Wyndham Clark (1<sup>st</sup>/-17)**

- Earns third PGA TOUR victory in his 146<sup>th</sup> start at the age of 30 years, 1 month, 26 days (2023 Wells Fargo Championship, 2023 U.S. Open, 2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am)
- With the victory, Clark receives 700 FedExCup points and moves to No. 3 in the FedExCup standings
- Ties Viktor Hovland for the most PGA TOUR wins since May 1, 2023 (3; Hovland’s wins: 2023 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2023 BMW Championship, 2023 TOUR Championship)
- Third-round 12-under 60 sets course record at Pebble Beach Golf Links (62: Matthias Schwab/2022, Patrick Cantlay/2021, David Duval/1997, Tom Kite/1983)
- 60 equals the tournament 18-hole scoring record (60: Sung Kang/R2/2016/Monterey Peninsula CC)
- Records the 54<sup>th</sup> 60 in PGA TOUR history, with Nick Dunlap the most recent to do so (2023 American Express/R3)
- Previous-low score on TOUR was 61 (2020 WM Phoenix Open/R1)
- Front-nine 28 in the third round ties the lowest score on Pebble Beach’s front nine at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; fourth player to perform the feat (most recent: Brent Schwarzrock/R1/2002); first 28 or better on TOUR since Eric Cole at the 2023 RSM Classic (R3)

- Career-high 189 feet, 9 inches of putts made en route to 60; previous best was 156 feet, 6 inches (R3, 2020 Shriners Children's Open)
- Wins in his fourth start at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T61/2019, T18/2020, T65/2022, Won/2024)

**Ludvig Åberg (2<sup>nd</sup>/-16)**

- 2023 RSM Classic champion finishes runner-up for the second time in 20 PGA TOUR starts (2023 Sanderson Farms Championship)
- After opening with a 4-under 68 at Spyglass Hill, played 36 bogey-free holes at Pebble Beach (65/R2, 67/R3)
- One of 11 players in the field that made AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am debut

**Matthieu Pavon (3<sup>rd</sup>/-15)**

- Led the field with 22 birdies (four more than any other player)
- Last week's winner of the Farmers Insurance Open finishes third in bid to become the first player to earn his first two wins in consecutive events on the TOUR schedule since David Duval in 1997 (Michelob Championship at Kingsmill, Walt Disney World/Oldsmobile Classic)
