Keegan Bradley (1st/-12)

- Seeks seventh PGA TOUR victory in his 352nd start and holds the 54-hole lead by one stroke
- PGA TOUR victories (6): 2011 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, 2011 PGA Championship, 2012 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2018 BMW Championship, 2022 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 2023 Travelers Championship
- 2018 BMW Championship winner would become the event’s 20th multiple winner
- Enters the week No. 50 in the FedExCup standings, receiving the final spot in this week’s 50-player field
- Projected to move to No. 4; seeks to reach the TOUR Championship for the sixth time
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the seventh time on TOUR; 1-for-6 to date (T2/2012 Genesis Invitational, 2nd/2013 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, 2nd/2021 Valspar Championship, T2/2022 Truist Championship, Won/2023 Travelers Championship, T2/2024 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- 22 third-round leaders/co-leaders have gone on to win stroke-play events this season (most recent: Hideki Matsuyama/FedEx St. Jude Championship); last 54-hole leader to win the BMW Championship is Patrick Cantlay in 2022
- Would be the fourth 18-hole leader to win a stroke-play events this season (most recent: Xander Schauffele/PGA Championship); the last 18-hole leader/co-leader to win the BMW Championship is Justin Thomas (2019)

Adam Scott (2nd/-11)

- Seeks his 15th official TOUR title in his 406th start and first since the 2020 Genesis Invitational, which would end a winless drought of 4 years, 6 months, 9 days
- Seeks to reach the TOUR Championship for the 10th time in the FedExCup era (2007) and first since 2022; failed to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in 2022-23 for the first time since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007
- Win would come at the age of 44 years, 1 month, 9 days to become the second player in his 40s with a victory this season (Brice Garnett/Puerto Rico Open)
- Would become the fifth Australian to win the BMW Championship (Marc Leishman/2017, Jason Day/2015, Robert Allenby/2000, Bruce Crampton/1971)
- As a 20-year-old, played at Castle Pines in The INTERNATIONAL in 2000 (MC), his first start in America on the PGA TOUR (Note: played in The Open Championship in 2000, his first official PGA TOUR start)

Miscellaneous Notes

- One of 11 players making their BMW Championship debut, 2023 RSM Classic winner **Ludvig Åberg** (T3/-10) seeks to become the first player since 2006 to win in first tournament start (Trevor Immelman/Cog Hill G&CC)
- **Alex Noren** (T3/-10), who entered the week No. 45 in the FedExCup standings, seeks his first PGA TOUR victory in his 183rd start; has three top-10s this season
- Notable scores through 36 holes:
 - Two-time major winner in 2024 **Xander Schauffele** (T5/-7)
 - Denver, Colorado native **Wyndham Clark** (T5/-7)

- Three-time FedExCup Champion **Rory McIlroy** (T9/-5)
- Defending BMW Championship and FedExCup champion **Viktor Hovland** (T24/-3)
- FedExCup leader and World No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (T35/+1)
- Three rookies in the field: **Nick Dunlap** (T9/-5), **Max Greyserman** (T33/E), **Matthieu Pavon** (44th/+5)
- First-year TOUR member **Robert MacIntyre** (lower back) withdrew during the third round
