Keegan Bradley (Winner/-12)

- Picks up his seventh PGA TOUR victory in his 352nd start at the age of 38 years, 2 months, 18 days
- PGA TOUR victories (7): 2011 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, 2011 PGA Championship, 2012 WGC-Bridgestone Invitational, 2018 BMW Championship, 2022 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 2023 Travelers Championship, 2024 BMW Championship
- Wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since his first two seasons on TOUR (2011, 2012)
- 20th multiple winner of the event; wins in 2018 and 2024 account for his only two top-10 finishes in 12 starts
- Entered the week No. 50 in the FedExCup and moves to No. 4 to advance to the TOUR Championship for the sixth time
- Improves to 2-for-7 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead (T2/2012 Genesis Invitational, 2nd/2013 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, 2nd/2021 Valspar Championship, T2/2022 Truist Championship, Won/2023 Travelers Championship, T2/2024 Sony Open in Hawaii, Won/2024 BMW Championship)
- 23rd third-round leader/co-leader to win a stroke-play event this season; first 54-hole leader to win the BMW Championship since Patrick Cantlay in 2022
- Wins for the first time in 11 attempts when holding the first-round lead/co-lead
- Fourth 18-hole leader to win a stroke-play event this season and the first at the event since Justin Thomas (2019)
- Led the field in Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (11.192) and was second in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.917)
- Wins on the same day as fellow United States Presidents Cup captain's assistant Stewart Cink (The Ally Challenge/PGA TOUR Champions)

Additional Player Notes

- **Adam Scott** finishes runner-up for the second time in his last four starts (Genesis Scottish Open) and for the 16th time in his career; moves from No. 41 to No. 14 in the FedExCup, reaching the TOUR Championship for the 10th time in the FedExCup era (since 2007) and first since 2022; failed to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs last season for the first time in his career
- **Sam Burns** turns in the round of the day with a 7-under 65 and picks up the fourth runner-up finish of his career
- 2023 RSM Classic champion **Ludvig Åberg** finishes runner-up for the fourth time in his career, with three coming this season (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, Masters Tournament, BMW Championship)
