Rafael Campos (1st/-19)

- Seven days removed from the birth of he and his wife’s first child, Paola, the 54-hole co-leader followed a career-low 9-under 62 in round three with a 3-under 68 to finish at 19-under 265 and claim his first career PGA TOUR title
- His victory comes in his 80th TOUR start at the age of 36 years, 7 months, 2 days
- With the win, moves from No. 147 in the FedExCup Fall standings to 80th
- The win comes in his third start at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship (T18/2019, MC/2020)
- With the win, becomes the second Puerto Rico native to win on the PGA TOUR and first since Chi Chi Rodriguez (eight wins between 1963-1979)
- Victory supplants his previous-best finish of T2/2021 Corales Puntacana Championship
- Came into the week on the heels of 13 missed cuts in his most recent 15 starts
- Winner of The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club in 2019 on the Korn Ferry Tour
- Made his way back to the PGA TOUR this season by virtue of the Top 30 in 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List (No. 30)

Additional notes

- Seeking his first PGA TOUR title in his 85th start, 54-hole co-leader **Andrew Novak** followed his career-low PGA TOUR round of 9-under 62 in round three with an even-par 71 to finish solo-second at 16-under 268; his career-best finish marks his fifth top 10 of the season and seventh overall on TOUR; with the finish, moves from No. 93 in the FedExCup Fall standings to No. 70; Nos. 51-60 after this week’s RSM Classic in the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2025: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
- On the heels of missed cuts in seven of his last nine starts on TOUR before this week, Belgium’s **Adrien Dumont de Chassart** posted four rounds in the 60s of his first Butterfield Bermuda Championship to finish T3 at 15-under 269; TOUR rookie’s lone top-10 finish prior to this week was T6/Puerto Rico Open
- Seeking a first win on TOUR in his 230th start, **Mark Hubbard** closed his fourth Butterfield Bermuda Championship with a 5-under 66 to finish T3 at 15-under 269; with the finish, is projected No. 63 in the FedExCup Fall standings
- **Justin Lower**, the 18- and 36-hole leader/co-leader, closed with a 1-over 72 to finish T5 at 14-under 270
- **Vince Whaley** closed with a 3-under 68 to finish T5 at 14-under 270; previous finishes at this event: T8/2023, T7/2021, MC/2020
- Defending champion **Camilo Villegas** closed with a 2-over 73 and finished T47 at 5-under 279

FedExCup Fall Notes

- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2025: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational
- Into the top 60 after this week: **Nico Echavarria** (T29; from No. 61 to No. 59)
- Out of the top 60: **Kevin Yu** (MC; from No. 60 to No. 61)

- The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn full Korn Ferry Tour status and conditional status on TOUR next season
- Into the Top 125 after this week: **Rafael Campos** (1st; from No. 147 to No. 80), **Sam Ryder** (T5; from No. 135 to No. 122), **Wesley Bryan** (T17; from No. 128 to No. 125)
- Out of the Top 125: **Henrik Norlander** (T57; from No. 122 to No. 126), **Daniel Berger** (T62; from No. 124 to No. 127), **Hayden Springer** (T37; from No. 125 to No. 128)
