Charley Hoffman (1st/-5)

- Cards a bogey-free 5-under 65 for a one-stroke lead after the first round of the Charles Schwab Challenge
- Eighth career 18-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR; 0-for-7 to date, most recently finishing T6 at the 2020 Sanderson Farms Championship
- Also held the first-round co-lead at the 2022 Barracuda Championship (Modified Stableford scoring format), finishing T31
- The last 18-hole leader/co-leader to win the Charles Schwab Challenge: Zach Johnson (2012)
- Making his 15th start at the Charles Schwab Challenge, with a T3 in 2021 his best finish
- Seeks his fifth PGA TOUR title and first since the 2016 Valero Texas Open
- Lost in a playoff to Nick Taylor at the WM Phoenix Open for his best finish in 12 starts this season
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (2.471), Strokes Gained: Tee to Green (4.916)

Additional Player Notes

- World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler (T79/+2) cards a 2-over 72 in his fifth career start at the Charles Schwab Challenge where he
 has top-three finishes the last two years (T3/2023, 2nd/2022); marks his first over-par opening round since the 2023 TOUR
 Championship (71)
- 2014 champion Adam Scott (T21/-1) records an opening-round 1-under 69 in his first start at Colonial since 2018; is the only player to have won all four of the TOUR's annual stops in Texas (Texas Children's Houston Open, Valero Texas Open, CJ CUP Byron Nelson, Charles Schwab Challenge)
- 2016 champion **Jordan Spieth** (T63/+1) posts his second over-par opening round in 12 starts at the Charles Schwab Challenge; opened last year with a 72 en route to missing the cut for the first time in 11 starts at Colonial Country Club
- Defending champion **Emiliano Grillo** (T111/+4) opens with a 4-over 74; Ben Hogan is the only player to successfully defend at the Charles Schwab Challenge
- Adam Schenk (+5) withdrew following the first round (back)
