Additional Notes

- Hole No. 10 will play to a par 5 this year.
- Fairway lines were widened in May 2023 back to grassing lines from 2012-13. In all one acre of fairway grass was added since last year.
- El Nino weather pattern dropped 9.58" of rain on the course from Dec. 12-Jan. 31.
- El Nino has affected turfgrass in Florida with the cloudiest December since 1940 and cloudiest January since 1941. Turfgrass needs sun to survive.
- This is the 2nd consecutive tournament Wilson has not had an assistant superintendent.
