TOP STORYLINES

The Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches is the second of two Full-Field Events leading up to the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard. The Aon Next 10 for the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard will be filled with the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings through the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches that did not finish in the top 50 of the 2022-23 FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List, while the Aon Swing 5 will be made up of the next five players earning the most points in the Mexico Open at Vidanta and the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches.

Chris Kirk won the 2023 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches in a playoff over **Eric Cole**, earning his fifth PGA TOUR title and first since the 2015 Charles Schwab Challenge (snapped a winless drought of 7 years, 9 months, 13 days). Kirk, who won The Sentry to open the 2024 season, enters the week No. 4 in the FedExCup standings. Kirk is one of 10 past champions in the field.

Following his runner-up at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, Cole became the only rookie to advance to the 2023 BMW Championship and went on to win the Arnold Palmer Award as the 2022-23 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year. He comes into the week a career-high 36th in the Official World Golf Ranking, 294 spots higher than in 2023 (moved from No. 330 to No. 179 with the runner-up in 2023).

2012 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches champion **Rory McIlroy** is making his 10th start in the event and first since 2018 (T59). McIlroy is making his third start of the season and first in a Full-Field Event following a T66 at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and T24 at The Genesis Invitational. McIlroy, a 24-time PGA TOUR winner, has won six different TOUR events multiple times.

2022 U.S. Open winner **Matt Fitzpatrick** is making his third start at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches and first since becoming a PGA TOUR member at the start of the 2019-20 season. Fitzpatrick received sponsor exemptions in 2016 (MC) and 2017 (68th). Fitzpatrick, No. 9, is one of two players in the field in the top 10 of the Official World Golf Ranking, along with McIlroy (No. 2). This is the first time the event has had multiple top-10 players in the field since 2019 (3).

PGA TOUR rookie **Jake Knapp** won last week's Mexico Open at Vidanta, earning his first career title on TOUR. With the victory, Knapp moved to No. 8 in the FedExCup standings and earned a spot in all five remaining Signature Events in 2024. He also received exemptions to THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament, PGA Championship and 2025 Sentry. Knapp is looking to become the first player to earn his first two wins in consecutive starts since Camilo Villegas in 2008 (BMW Championship, TOUR Championship) and the first player to earn his first two wins in consecutive events on the TOUR schedule since David Duval in 1997 (Michelob Championship at Kingsmill, Walt Disney World/Oldsmobile Classic). Knapp is the third rookie to win on TOUR through eight events this season, matching the total number of rookie winners on TOUR in 54 events during the 2022-23 season.

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

Finland's **Sami Valimaki** finished solo-second at last week's Mexico Open at Vidanta, his first career top-10 on the PGA TOUR. With the runner-up, Valimaki moved to No. 1 in the Aon Swing 5 standings, securing a spot in next week's Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (will be his first start in a Signature Event). Valimaki, a PGA TOUR rookie, earned his TOUR card through the DP World Tour Top 10.

Four-time PGA TOUR winner **Ryan Palmer** is making his 500th career start on the PGA TOUR, becoming the first player to reach the milestone since Lucas Glover at the 2023 Valero Texas Open. He is making his 17th start at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, highlighted by a runner-up in 2014 (lost in a four-man playoff won by Russell Henley; other runners-up: Russell Knox, Rory McIlroy). With the exception of the 2019-20 season, which was shortened due to COVID-19, Palmer is the only player on TOUR that has played in at least 20 events in each season since he joined the PGA TOUR in 2004.

First start: 1998 U.S. Open (MC) as an amateur

First start as a professional: 2002 Valero Texas Open (MC) as an Open Qualifier

First start as a TOUR member: 2004 Sony Open in Hawaii (T64)

Shane Lowry has finished in the top five at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches in each of the last two years (2nd/2022, T5/2023), representing half of his top-five finishes on TOUR since the start of the 2021-22 season (others: T3/2022 Masters Tournament, T3/2022 RBC Heritage).

Stephan Jaeger finished T3 at last week's Mexico Open at Vidanta, his second T3 in his last three starts (Farmers Insurance Open). Jaeger did not record a top-three finish on TOUR in 128 prior starts. Jaeger has made four prior starts at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches (best result: T14/2023).

Justin Lower finished T3 at last week's Mexico Open, his career-high finish on the PGA TOUR. Lower finished T64 at the 2022 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, his only prior start at the event.

Rookie and 2023 Korn Ferry Tour graduate **Parker Coody** is competing on a sponsor exemption, joining his twin brother, Pierceson, in the field. Parker and Pierceson made their professional debuts at the 2023 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, with Pierceson receiving a sponsor exemption (T63) and Parker getting in as an Open Qualifier (MC).

The 10th hole at PGA National (The Champion) has been converted from a 508-yard par 4 in 2023 to a 530-yard par 5 in 2024. During the 2022-23 season, the 14-hole stretch from No. 4 through No. 17 at PGA National was the longest on the PGA TOUR without a par 5.
