## Second-Round Notes – Friday, April 19, 2024

**Weather:** Partly cloudy. High of 87. Wind NE 8-14 mph, gusting to 24 mph. **Cut:** 70 professionals at 4-under 140 from a field of 130 professionals and two amateurs.

## Wesley Bryan (1<sup>st</sup>/-15)

- Playing on a sponsor exemption, follows career-low 18-hole score 63 with a 6-under 66 in the second round
- At 15-under 129, posts the tournament 36-hole scoring record by two shots (131/Brice Garnett/2018)
- 129 marks his low opening 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 130/2016 John Deere Classic)
- Holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for the third time on TOUR (2016 John Deere Classic/T8, 2017 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches/T4)
- Would become the second player to win competing on a sponsor exemption on TOUR this season (Nick Dunlap/The American Express)
- Making third start at the event (T15/2022, MC/2023) and second start this season (MC/Puerto Rico Open)
- Owns seven scores of par-or-better in eight rounds at Corales Puntacana Championship (73/R2/2023)
- Five of the six champions of the Corales Puntacana Championship were in their 30s when they won (Chad Ramey/29)
- Has one win in 114 prior PGA TOUR starts (2017 RBC Heritage)
- Three-time Korn Ferry Tour winner, all from the 2016 season

## **Miscellaneous Notes**

- 4-under represents the lowest 36-hole cut in tournament history (previous: 3-under/2020) and matches lowest cut on TOUR this season (Puerto Rico Open)
- With 10 birdies, Justin Lower (2<sup>nd</sup>/-14) records a career-best and matches tournament record for most birdies in a round (Chip McDaniel/R4/2019, Graeme McDowell/R3/2019); his best finish on TOUR came earlier this season at the Mexico Open at Vidanta (T3)
- Making his third consecutive start at the event, Greyson Sigg (3<sup>rd</sup>/-11) owns top-25 finishes in both prior starts (T9/2021, T25/2022); seeking first career PGA TOUR title in his 84th start and would become the sixth first-time winner on TOUR this season and fifth in tournament history (Brice Garnett/2018, Joel Dahmen/2021, Chad Ramey/2022, Matt Wallace/2023)
- At T4 (-10), Kevin Tway is the only player bogey-free through 36 holes
- Past champions in the field: Chad Ramey (T25/-6), Joel Dahmen (T36/-5)
- Following a T16 finish at the Masters Tournament last week, **Nicolai Højgaard**, the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 34 in the Official World Golf Ranking, misses the cut with scores of 73-72
- Kevin Chappell (MC/+5) records first albatross in tournament history on No.4 and fourth albatross on TOUR this season: Jake Knapp (The American Express), Shane Lowry (Farmers Insurance Open), Robby Shelton (Valspar Championship)
