Billy Horschel (Winner/-23)

- Picks up his eighth PGA TOUR victory in his 333rd start at the age of 37 years, 4 months, 14 days
- **PGA TOUR victories (8):** 2013 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2014 BMW Championship, 2014 TOUR Championship, 2017 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, 2021 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play, 2022 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2024 Corales Puntacana Championship
- Collects 300 points and moves from No. 76 to a projected No. 45 in the FedExCup standings
- Moves to No. 1 in Aon Swing 5; the five players (not exempt via the Aon Next 10 or a higher category) who earn the most FedExCup points in the Corales Puntacana Championship, Zurich Classic of New Orleans and THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson will qualify for the Wells Fargo Championship
- Moves from No. 84 to a projected No. 64 in the Official World Golf Ranking
- Becomes the sixth of seven champions of the Corales Puntacana Championship to win in their 30s (Chad Ramey/29)
- Wins in his debut appearance at the Corales Puntacana Championship, first time in his career winning when making first start at an event
- Entered the final round trailing by three strokes, largest final-round comeback in tournament history (previous: 2/Chad Ramey/2022)
- With a final-round 9-under 63, ties the 18-hole tournament record: Brice Garnett (R1/2018), Chip McDaniel (R4/2019), Akshay Bhatia (R2/2023), Wesley Bryan (R1/2024)
- At 23-under 265, sets the 72-hole tournament scoring record by four strokes (previous: 269/Matt Wallace/2023)

Miscellaneous Notes

- Four players posted four rounds in the 60s in a single tournament; prior to this week, only three players had (Hudson Swafford/2020, Sam Stevens/2023, Austin Eckroat/2023)
- Entering the final round with his first 54-hole lead on TOUR, sponsor exemption **Wesley Bryan** (2nd/-21) records his first runner-up finish on TOUR and best finish since winning the 2017 RBC Heritage; was attempting to become the second wire-to-wire victor in tournament history (Brice Garnett/2018) and first on TOUR since Lee Hodges (2023 3M Open)
- In search of his second PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2018 Fortinet Championship, **Kevin Tway** (3rd/-18) earns his best finish on TOUR since solo-third at the 2017 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with partner Kelly Kraft)
- Charley Hoffman (T4/-18) records his second top-10 finish on TOUR this season (P2/WM Phoenix Open), his most on TOUR in a season since 2020-21 (5)
- With a T9 finish, **Peter Kuest** earns his second top-10 of the season (T10/Valero Texas Open) and a start in the next full field event at THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson
