Matthieu Pavon (1st/-13)

- PGA TOUR rookie birdies the 72nd hole to win his first TOUR title at 31 years, 2 months, 25 days in his 11th career start (third as a TOUR member)
- Earns 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings
- First player representing France to win on TOUR since World War II; Martin Trainer won the 2019 Puerto Rico Open while representing the United States and has since changed his nationality to France
- Players from France to finish runner-up on TOUR since World War II entering the week: Jean Van de Velde (3), Thomas Levet (1), Gregory Havret (1), Victor Dubuisson (1)
- Joins Nick Dunlap (The American Express) as the second first-time winner this season
- Earned his card for the 2024 season via the inaugural DP World Tour Top 10, which awarded TOUR cards to the top 10 players on the final 2023 Race to Dubai Points List (finished 8th); joined the DP World Tour in 2017 and took 185 starts to earn his first title at the 2023 Acciona Open de Espana
- Finished T7 in his season debut at the Sony Open in Hawaii
- Entered the week as the highest-ranked player from France in the Official World Golf Ranking; when the field for the Olympic Golf Men's Competition is finalized following the U.S. Open, the highest-ranked French player in the OWGR will earn a spot in the Paris 2024 field, per the Olympic Golf Ranking.

The Farmers Insurance Open, the fourth event of the 2024 PGA TOUR Season and third Full-Field Event, marked the third and final opportunity for players to earn FedExCup points towards the Aon Swing 5. The top five players not otherwise exempt who earned the most FedExCup points during the Sony Open in Hawaii, The American Express and Farmers Insurance Open qualify for next week's AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, while the top five players not otherwise exempt who earn the most FedExCup points for those three events and the WM Phoenix Open, will qualify for The Genesis Invitational.

Miscellaneous notes

- Making his 22nd start, but first start as a full member of the PGA TOUR, 22-year-old Dane **Nicolai Højgaard** (2nd/-12) posts 70 with a birdie on the 72nd hole to collect his second career runner-up finish on TOUR (2023 Corales Puntacana Championship); earned his TOUR card via non-member FedExCup points and earned exemptions into the 2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational as the highest-ranked player, not otherwise exempt, from the final 2023 Race to Dubai Points List, not otherwise exempt
- In search of his first TOUR title, 36- and 54-hole leader **Stephan Jaeger** (T3/-11) finishes T3, his best career result on TOUR in 129 career starts
- In his seventh career start on TOUR, rookie **Jake Knapp** (T3/-11) collects his first top-10 after finishing no better than 70th in his six previous starts (2019 RBC Canadian Open); finished 13th on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Regular Season Points List to earn his TOUR card
- After missing the cut in his first two starts this season, **Nate Lashley** (T3/-11) records his first top-five finish on TOUR since the 2023 Puerto Rico Open (T3)
- First-round leader **Kevin Yu** (T6/-10) closes with a bogey-free 67, including birdies on the final two holes, to finish inside the top-10 in back-to-back weeks on TOUR for the first time (T3/The American Express); Yu earned his spot into next week's Signature Event at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am by finishing fourth in the Aon Swing 5
- Shane Lowry (T25/-6) makes double eagle at the par-5 sixth hole from 256 yards, the second on TOUR this season (Jake Knapp/R2/No. 11/Nicklaus Tournament Course/The American Express); marks the first time since 2019 with a double eagle in back-to-back weeks on TOUR in a stroke-play event (Shubhankar Sharma/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday; Kramer Hickok/RBC Canadian Open)
- With a T37 at the Farmers Insurance Open, Maverick McNealy (T37/-4) earned enough FedExCup points to satisfy
 his Major Medical Extension. McNealy is now eligible to play the remainder of the season out of the Major Medical
 category.
