Hideki Matsuyama (Winner/-17)

- 10th PGA TOUR title and first in a FedExCup Playoffs event in his 261st start at the age of 32 years, 5 months, 24 days
- Moves from No. 8 to No. 3 in the FedExCup; has 11 consecutive finishes inside the top 50 in the FedExCup, the longest active streak on TOUR; best finish in the FedExCup: 8th (2017)
- Sixth multiple winner of the season (The Genesis Invitational); others: Scottie Scheffler/6, Rory McIlroy/2, Xander Schauffele/2, Robert MacIntyre/2, Nick Dunlap/2
- **PGA TOUR wins (10):** 2014 Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, 2016 WM Phoenix Open, 2016 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions, 2017 WM Phoenix Open, 2017 World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational, 2021 Masters Tournament, 2021 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2024 Genesis Invitational, 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- Began the final round with a five-stroke lead, the largest 54-hole lead on TOUR this season; fell out of the lead after playing
 Nos. 12-15 in 4-over but converted birdies on Nos. 17 and 18
- Has successfully converted his last three 54-hole leads on TOUR (2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship, 2021 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP, 2021 Masters Tournament) and improves to 4-for-7 overall
- Win comes in his first start since winning the bronze medal at the 2024 Paris Olympics at Le Golf National
- Will make his 10th TOUR Championship appearance in 11 seasons on TOUR (last: 2022)
- 70 marks his 14th consecutive round of par or better at TPC Southwind, the longest active streak on TOUR
- 263 marks his second-lowest 72-hole total on TOUR (257; 2022 Sony Open in Hawaii/Won)
- 11th international player to win a FedExCup Playoffs event and the first from Japan

Additional Player Notes

- FedExCup No. 2 Xander Schauffele (T2/-15) began the final round nine strokes off the lead before posting 63, his lowest final-round score on TOUR this season (previous: 65, four times; most recent: The Open Championship); third runner-up finish this season (THE PLAYERS Championship, Truist Championship)
- Reigning FedExCup Champion **Viktor Hovland** (T2/-15) posts 66 to finish T2, his second top-10 finish of the season and his best result on TOUR since his win at the 2023 TOUR Championship; moves from No. 57 to No. 16 in the FedExCup and will defend his title at next week's BMW Championship
- FedExCup No. 1 **Scottie Scheffler** (4th/-14) collects his 11th top-five finish in 17 starts this season; retains his lead in the FedExCup over Xander Schauffele by 1,496 points
- Beginning the final round in second place, PGA TOUR Rookie **Nick Dunlap** (T5/-13) made a par on the 18th hole to secure his position in the top 50 (No. 48) and advance to the BMW Championship
- **Keegan Bradley** (T59/+1) began the week at No. 39 in the FedExCup and finished at No. 50; 2018 BMW Championship winner will make his 12th career appearance in the event
- In addition to being fully exempt for the 2025 PGA TOUR Season and THE PLAYERS Championship, the top 50 players in the FedExCup qualify for all eight Signature Events in 2025. Of the 50 players who advanced to the BMW Championship, 19 were not in the top 50 of the final 2023 FedExCup standings (38 percent)

• 11 players will make their debut at the BMW Championship next week: Ludvig Åberg (No. 7), Robert MacIntyre (No. 12), Akshay Bhatia (No. 13), Matthieu Pavon (No. 20), Aaron Rai (No. 21), Davis Thompson (No. 26), Stephan Jaeger (No. 35), Austin Eckroat (No. 38), Thomas Detry (No. 40), Max Greyserman (No. 47), Nick Dunlap (No. 48); three of the four rookies who qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs will advance to the BMW Championship: Matthieu Pavon (No. 20), Max Greyserman (No. 47) and Nick Dunlap (No. 48)
