**Ludvig Åberg (1<sup>st</sup>/-12)**

- Posts his career-low 36-hole total (128) on the PGA TOUR (previous: 131/2023 RSM Classic/Won) and the lowest 36-hole total at the Genesis Scottish Open since 2022 when it began being co-sanctioned by the PGA TOUR and DP World Tour (130/Rory McIlroy/2023)
- Fourth career 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and second in three starts (U.S. Open/finished T12); 1-for-3 converting the victory (2023 RSM Classic)
- Two runner-up results in 14 starts on TOUR in 2024 (2<sup>nd</sup>/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2<sup>nd</sup>/Masters Tournament); six top-10 finishes this season is tied with Collin Morikawa for the second-most of any player in the field (most: 11/Xander Schauffele)
- Seeks his second PGA TOUR title in his 31<sup>st</sup> start (2023 RSM Classic); won the 2023 Omega European Masters in his sixth career start on the DP World Tour
- At World No. 4, seeks to become the second consecutive player to win the Genesis Scottish Open after entering the week inside the top five in the Official World Golf Ranking (Rory McIlroy/No. 3/2023)

**Additional Player Notes**

- Three-time DP World Tour winner **Antoine Rozner** (2<sup>nd</sup>/-11) posts bogey-free 64; owns three top-20 finishes in eight career starts on the PGA TOUR entering the week (T20/2023 Open Championship, T18/2021 the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T18/2021 World Golf Championships-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- **Sungjae Im** (T3/-10) seeks his third PGA TOUR title and first since the 2021 Shriners Children’s Open; owns 22 top-10 finishes in 74 starts since his latest victory, including five this season
- Italy’s **Matteo Manassero** (T3/-10) holes eight birdies for a 63 and leads the field in birdies with 14 through round two; enters the week at No. 10 in the DP World Tour Top 10, which offers a PGA TOUR card to the top-10 players in the final Race to Dubai Ranking who are not otherwise exempt
- Defending champion **Rory McIlroy** (T5/-9) posts his sixth consecutive score of 68 or better at The Renaissance Club; looks to successfully defend a title on TOUR for the third time in his career, but first at the same venue:
  - 2021, 2022 THE CJ CUP in South Carolina (The Summit Club, Congaree Golf Club)
  - 2019, 2022 RBC Canadian Open (Hamilton Golf & Country Club, St. George’s Golf Course)
- **Collin Morikawa** (T5/-9) has not finished lower than T16 in an individual stroke-play event on the PGA TOUR since the Valero Texas Open in April (T75); five of his six top-10 finishes this season have come in his last nine starts
- **Sahith Theegala** (T5/-9) cards 65 after overcoming a double bogey at the par-4 18<sup>th</sup> hole (his ninth of the round); seeks his first top-10 finish on TOUR since a runner-up at the RBC Heritage
- Spain’s **Alejandro Del Rey** (T5/-9) makes six consecutive birdies (Nos. 1-6) for a 62, the low score in round two; Del Rey was the last player in the field after Sebastian Söderberg withdrew on Wednesday
