Ludvig Åberg (1st/-17)

- Birdies two of his final three holes and posts his second-lowest 54-hole total (193) on the PGA TOUR (192/2023 RSM Classic/Won)
- Second career 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR (2023 RSM Classic/Won); both 54-hole leaders at the Genesis Scottish Open since 2022 have gone on to win (Rory McIlroy/2023/led by 1, Xander Schauffele/2022/led by 2)
- Seeks his second PGA TOUR title in his 31st career start (2023 RSM Classic); won the 2023 Omega European Masters in his sixth career start on the DP World Tour
- Making his second start at the Genesis Scottish Open; missed the cut in his tournament debut in 2023
- Two runner-up results in 14 starts on TOUR in 2024 (2nd/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, 2nd/Masters Tournament); six top-10 finishes this season is tied with Collin Morikawa for the second-most of any player in the field (most: 11/Xander Schauffele)

Robert MacIntyre (2nd/-15)

- First-year TOUR member posts 7-under 63 for the low score in round three
- Finished runner-up at the 2023 Genesis Scottish Open; the last player to finish runner-up and win the same tournament the next year is Nick Taylor (2023, 2024 WM Phoenix Open)
- Seeks his second PGA TOUR title in his 49th career start (2024 RBC Canadian Open); earned his PGA TOUR card for the 2024 season after finishing No. 7 in the 2023 DP World Tour Top 10
- Would become the third multiple winner on TOUR this season, joining Scottie Scheffler (6) and Rory McIlroy (2)
- Colin Montgomerie (1999) is the only player from Scotland to win the Genesis Scottish Open in the 41 times it has been played since first being introduced on the DP World Tour in 1972

Additional Player Notes

- **Adam Scott** (3rd/-14) takes his best position through 54 holes on the PGA TOUR since the 2020 Genesis Invitational (T1); seeks his 16th career TOUR title in his 403rd start and first since the 2020 Genesis Invitational, which would end a winless drought of 4 years, 4 months, 28 days
- Scott enters the week No. 71 in the FedExCup standings; failed to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in 2022-23 for the first time since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007 (finished No. 72)
- France's **Antoine Rozner** (T4/-13) sits highest on the leaderboard among those players who are not yet qualified for next week's Open Championship; the top three players, not otherwise exempt, will earn an exemption
