- Area had driest year ever in 2023, and 2024 was the wettest ever at Tiburon.
 Course is more than 30" above average rain, which caused setbacks in preparation and turf health.
- Hurricanes setback course preparations one week after heavy rain and clean up.
- Course hosted the CME Group Tour Championship Nov. 21-24.
- Average fairway widths are 50 yards.
- Land was formerly a tomato farm, and plants sometimes pop up in native areas.
- Wesley Rowe was promoted to superintendent last December.
