Pre-Tournament Notes – 2024 ISCO Championship

TOUR season notes

- The ISCO Championship is the 32nd event of the FedExCup Regular Season, with only four weeks remaining until the start of the FedExCup Playoffs
- Four players in this week's field finished in the top 10 at last week's John Deere Classic (Michael Thorbjornsen/T2, Luke Clanton/T2, Carson Young/T5, Hayden Springer/T7); Springer shot 59 (-12) in the opening round of last week's John Deere Classic

ISCO Championship notes

- ISCO Industries is a total piping solutions supplier with more than 35 facilities in the United States and Canada
- As part of the Strategic Alliance between the PGA TOUR and the DP World Tour, the ISCO Championship
 features a field of 156 players including 50 players from the DP World Tour with the winner receiving
 benefits on each Tour:
 - o FedExCup points: 300
 - o **DP World Tour Rankings points:** 710
 - o PGA TOUR exemption (for current PGA TOUR members): thru 2026
 - o PGA TOUR exemption (for non-members): thru 2025
 - DP World Tour exemption: thru 2026
- The field includes 42 players who have won on the PGA TOUR
- Last year, PGA TOUR rookie **Vincent Norrman**, from Sweden won his first PGA TOUR title in his 23rd start; his 72nd-hole bogey was his first of the day, leading to a playoff with England's **Nathan Kimsey**, which he won with a par at the first extra hole; it marked the third playoff in tournament history (2016, 2021, 2023)
- This week is the ninth edition of the ISCO Championship; aside from Scott Piercy's three-stroke victory in the inaugural event in 2015, the ISCO Championship has been decided by one stroke or a playoff in each of the seven editions since
- Florida State junior **Luke Clanton** makes his fourth PGA TOUR start; finished T41 at the 2024 U.S. Open in his TOUR debut, T10 at the 2024 Rocket Mortgage Classic and T2 at last week's John Deere Classic, where he became the first amateur to record top-10 finishes in back-to-back starts on TOUR since Billy Joe Patton (T8/1957 U.S. Open, T8/1958 Masters Tournament)
- Four-time PGA TOUR winner **Daniel Berger** makes his ISCO Championship debut; former Presidents Cup (2017) and Ryder Cup (2020) participant has one top-15 finish in 16 starts during the 2024 Regular Season (T13/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson)
- Sponsor exemption **Neal Shipley**, who was the low amateur at the Masters Tournament and U.S. Open in 2024, makes his third start on the PGA TOUR as a professional following the Rocket Mortgage Classic (T20) and the John Deere Classic (MC); finished T9 in his professional debut on PGA TOUR Americas in June, after earning PGA TOUR Americas status through Qualifying School earlier the same month
- Danville, Kentucky native Josh Teater makes his seventh appearance in his home-state event; missed cut in 2023 marked his first in six prior appearances, with T6 in 2019 his best showing; notched an under-par opening-round score in each of his seven starts
- Former Auburn University golfer **John Marshall Butler** makes his PGA TOUR debut after recently finishing T5 in his professional debut on PGA TOUR Americas, as does **Alex Goff**, the standout University of Kentucky lefthander who concluded his college career with 80 rounds of par-or-better, the second most in program history (J.B. Holmes/86)

- At No. 30, American **Johannes Veerman**, winner of the 2021 D+D Real Czech Masters, is the highest-ranked player on the Race to Dubai ranking in the field this week; Veerman's lone top-25 in seven starts on TOUR came at the 2023 Barracuda Championship (T20)
- There are four past champions of the ISCO Championship Classic in the field: **Scott Piercy** (2015), **Aaron Baddeley** (2016), **Troy Merritt** (2018), **Jim Herman** (2019)
