**Weather:** Partly cloudy. High of 91. Wind W 4-8 mph.

**36-Hole Cut Notes**

- 66 professionals and one amateur at 8-under 136 from a field of 155 professionals and one amateur
- Marks the low 36-hole cut relative to par in an individual stroke-play event on the PGA TOUR on record (1970-present); the previous record was 7-under at the 2020 Shriners Children’s Open
- Is the lowest cut in ISCO Championship history (previous: -5/2022)
- Local favorites who made the cut: **Cooper Musselman** (T15)
- Players with Kentucky connections who missed the cut by one shot: **Josh Teater**, **Stephen Stallings, Jr.**

**Pierceson Coody (1<sup>st</sup>/-16)**

- PGA TOUR rookie follows an 11-under 61 (his low round on TOUR) with a 67 to maintain the outright lead
- Would become the first wire-to-wire winner of the ISCO Championship and the first on TOUR since Lee Hodges at the 2023 3M Open
- At 128, tops his previous-low 36-hole score of 132 (2024 Charles Schwab Challenge/T5)
- Best finish in 26 starts on TOUR: T5/2024 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (5.508) and Strokes Gained: Around the Green (3.028)
- Holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for the first time (previous best position: T2/2024 Charles Schwab Challenge/T5)
- Second-round leaders/co-leaders to win the event: Troy Merritt (2018), Jim Herman (2019)
- Nine second-round leaders/co-leaders have won in individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season (most recent: Scottie Scheffler/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Would become the first player to win the event in debut appearance since Vincent Norrman (2023)
- Would become the first PGA TOUR rookie winner since Jake Knapp at the 2024 Mexico Open at Vidanta

**Additional Player Notes**

- **Chez Reavie** (T2/-14) is in search of his fourth TOUR victory in his 415<sup>th</sup> start (most recent: 2022 Barracuda Championship); bogey-free through 36 holes, including a second-round 62 in his 1,300<sup>th</sup> round on TOUR
- **Matthis Besard** (T2/-14) opens 67-63 in his debut appearance on the PGA TOUR; lone top-10 in 17 DP World Tour starts came in his most recent start at the 2024 BMW International Open (T6)
- PGA TOUR Canada and Korn Ferry Tour winner **Rico Hoey** (T2/-14) has one top-10 in 19 prior PGA TOUR starts (T6/2024 Rocket Mortgage Classic); along with Reavie and **Brandt Snedeker**, is bogey-free through 36 holes
- With rounds of 64-67 this week, **Hayden Springer** (T5/-13) is now 48-under in his last 10 rounds on TOUR; shot 59 (-12) in the opening round of last week’s John Deere Classic
- Along with **Reavie**, Louisville native and 2018 University of Kentucky graduate **Cooper Musselman** (T15/-11) turns in the round of the day with a 10-under 62; would become the first sponsor exemption to win on TOUR since Nick Dunlap at the 2024 American Express
- Along with Musselman, other sponsor exemptions who made the cut: **Neal Shipley** (T11), **Luke Clanton** (T31), **Jonathan Byrd** (T31); Shipley was the low amateur at the Masters Tournament and U.S. Open in

2024, while Clanton seeks to become the first amateur with three consecutive top-10s on TOUR since Ken Venturi in 1956

- **Harrison Endycott** (illness) withdrew prior to round two; **Paul Waring** (hip injury) withdrew during the round
