Pierceson Coody (1st/-20)

- After an even-par front nine, PGA TOUR rookie follows with a 4-under back nine to retain the solo lead
- Would become the first wire-to-wire winner of the ISCO Championship and the first on TOUR since Lee
 Hodges at the 2023 3M Open
- At 196, tops his previous-low 54-hole score of 201 (2024 Charles Schwab Challenge/T5)
- Best finish in 26 starts on TOUR: T5/2024 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the first time (previous best position: T3/2024 Charles Schwab Challenge/T5)
- Third-round leaders/co-leaders to win the event: Scott Piercy (2015), Troy Merritt (2018), Jim Herman (2019)
- 20 third-round leaders/co-leaders have won in individual stroke-play events on TOUR this season (most recent: Davis Thompson/John Deere Classic)
- Would become the first player to win the event in debut appearance since Vincent Norrman (2023)
- Would become the first PGA TOUR rookie winner since Jake Knapp at the 2024 Mexico Open at Vidanta

Additional Player Notes

- Harry Hall (T2/-19) is 15-under on the front nine this week, shooting 5-under 31 each of the first three rounds; in 18 starts this season, lone top-25 came at last week's John Deere Classic (T12)
- Manila, Philippines native and PGA TOUR rookie Rico Hoey (T2/-19) plays 53 holes before making his first bogey of the tournament at No. 18 after taking a penalty drop for an unplayable lie, the longest bogeyfree stretch of any player this week
- After making the cut on the number and sitting T49 through 36 holes, England's **Sam Bairstow** (T4/-18) posts a bogey-free 10-under 62 which included six consecutive birdies on hole Nos. 10-15
- Neal Shipley (T4/-18), the low amateur at the Masters Tournament and U.S. Open in 2024, finished T9 in his professional debut on PGA TOUR Americas in June; making third start on the PGA TOUR as a professional (T20/Rocket Mortgage Classic, MC/John Deere Classic)
- At No. 30, American **Johannes Veerman** (T4/-18), winner of the 2021 D+D Real Czech Masters, is the highest-ranked player on the Race to Dubai ranking in the field this week; lone top-25 in seven starts on TOUR came at the 2023 Barracuda Championship (T20)
- Jacques Kruyswijk (T9/-16) and Matthis Besard (T9/-16) each attempt to become the first player since Jim Benepe at the 1988 BMW Championship to win his first PGA TOUR start
- Spencer Cross (T19/-14) is making his first PGA TOUR start after advancing in a 13-for-10 playoff in prequalifying, and then winning the Monday qualifier with a 63; finished T10 in his first Korn Ferry Tour start, the 2024 Visit Knoxville Open
- Luke Clanton (T34/-12) seeks to become the first amateur with three consecutive top-10s on TOUR since Ken Venturi in 1956; one of six amateurs to make the cut at the ISCO Championship (T3/Robby Shelton/2015, T6/Sam Burns/2017, T53/Cullan Brown/2019, T58/David Ford/2023, T78/Maverick McNealy/2015)
