Harry Hall wins five-way playoff at the 2024 ISCO Championship

- Harry Hall chips in from 45' 6" for a birdie-2 on the third extra hole (No. 9) to win the first five-man playoff on the PGA TOUR since the 2023 Sanderson Farms Championship (won by Luke List)
- All five players were making their first playoff appearance on the PGA TOUR
- Fourth playoff in tournament history (2016, 2021, 2023, 2024)
- Seventh playoff this season (first since Scottie Scheffler defeated Tom Kim at the Travelers Championship)
- Wins the first three-hole playoff since the 2023 RBC Heritage (Matt Fitzpatrick def. Jordan Spieth)
- Aside from Scott Piercy's three-stroke victory in the inaugural event in 2015, the ISCO Championship has been decided by one stroke or in a playoff each year since

Harry Hall (Winner/-22)

- Earns his first PGA TOUR victory in his 58th start at the age of 26 years, 11 months, 8 days
- Earns 300 FedExCup and 500 DP World Tour Ranking points and earns fully exempt status on both Tours through 2026
- Joins Scott Piercy (2015), Grayson Murray (2017), Jim Herman (2019) and Vincent Norrman (2023) as winners in their debut appearance at the ISCO Championship
- Fifth player (fourth straight) to make the ISCO Championship his maiden TOUR title: Grayson Murray/2017, Seamus Power/2021, Trey Mullinax/2022 and Vincent Norrman/2023
- Becomes the season's 10th first-time winner and second in as many weeks (Davis Thompson/John Deere Classic)
- Is the 16th player (47 wins) from England to win on TOUR since 1940; first since Matt Fitzpatrick at the 2023 RBC Heritage; 10th international player to win on TOUR this season
- Fourth international winner at the ISCO Championship, joining Aaron Baddeley (2016/Australia), Seamus Power (2021/Ireland) and Vincent Norrman (2023/Sweden)
- Previous-best finish on TOUR: T3/2023 Charles Schwab Challenge

Additional Player Notes

- **Pierceson Coody** finishes runner-up after entering the final round attempting to become the first PGA TOUR rookie to win wire-to-wire (no ties) since Tim Herron at the 1996 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches; previous-best finish on TOUR: T5/2024 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Matt NeSmith finishes runner-up for the second time in 137 TOUR starts (2022 Shriners Children's Open)
- Zac Blair finishes runner-up for the second time in 193 TOUR starts (2023 Travelers Championship)
- TOUR rookie **Rico Hoey** finishes career-best runner-up in his 20th start (T6/2024 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- **Neal Shipley** (T6), the low amateur at the Masters Tournament and U.S. Open in 2024, picks up his first top-10 in his third professional start
- Seung-Yul Noh finishes T6 in his 77th start since his last top-10 finish (2017 Wells Fargo Championship/T5)
- Luke Clanton finishes T37 in bid to become the first amateur with three consecutive top-10s on TOUR since Ken Venturi in 1956
