C.T. Pan (T1/-14)

TPC Deere Run

- Holds first 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR and second after any round (R3/2023 RBC Canadian Open/finished T3)
- Second-round 63 falls one-stroke shy of his career-best (62/R4/2023 CJ CUP Byron Nelson/finished 4th)
- Seeks second PGA TOUR victory in his 193rd start on TOUR (2019 RBC Heritage)
- Making his fourth John Deere Classic start (T34/2018, MC/2021, T24/2022)
- One top-10 in 14 starts this season (T3/Mexico Open at Vidanta)

Aaron Rai (T1/-14)

- Holds second-consecutive 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR this season; held share of 36-hole lead at last week's Rocket Mortgage Classic and finished with a career-high T2
- Held a share of the 36-hole lead with partner David Lipsky at the 2024 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (finished T23)
- 128 marks career-best opening 36-hole score on TOUR (previous: 131/2024 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- Making John Deere Classic debut, seeks first PGA TOUR victory in his 86th start
- Seeks to become ninth first-time winner on TOUR this season (most recent: Robert MacIntyre/RBC Canadian Open)
- With a win, would become the 24th player to make the John Deere Classic his first PGA TOUR victory and first since 2019 (Dylan Frittelli)
- Has three top-10 finishes in 18 starts this season: T4/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, T7/Texas Children's Houston Open, T2/Rocket Mortgage Classic

Zach Johnson (T18/-10)

- Makes 19th cut at the event, the most made cuts in tournament history (previous: 18/D.A. Weibring)
- Making his 22nd career start at the John Deere Classic, four more than any player on TOUR since 2002 (Jonathan Byrd/18)
- Has 377 birdies in 80 rounds at TPC Deere Run, the most birdies made by a player on a single course since 2003
- Owns seven top-10s at the event, highlighted by a win in 2012 and runner-up finishes in 2009, 2013 and 2014

Additional Player Notes

- At 13-under 129, Harry Hall (3rd/-13) matches career-best opening 36-hole score on TOUR (2023 Charles Schwab Challenge/finished career-best: T3)
- In his third PGA TOUR start, 20-year-old amateur **Luke Clanton** (T4/-12) from Florida State University is playing on a sponsor exemption; best finish by an amateur at the John Deere Classic is T15 (Patrick Rodgers/2013)
- Following a T3 at the Travelers Championship in his most recent start, **Sungjae Im** (T4/-12), the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 15 in the FedExCup is making his third start at the event (T26/2019, T47/2021)

- One day after becoming the 13th different player (14 times) to shoot a sub-60 round on TOUR, PGA TOUR rookie **Hayden Springer** (T4/-12) follows with an even-par 71; prior to last week's T10 at the Rocket Mortgage Classic, had missed six consecutive cuts (career-best result on TOUR in 14 starts: T3/Puerto Rico Open)
- Making his first start at the event since 2015, two-time John Deere Classic champion Jordan Spieth (T47/-6) cards 4under 67 and sits eight shots back after 36-holes
- Jimmy Stanger withdrew prior to his second round due to an elbow injury
