Scottie Scheffler – history with the 54-hole lead/co-lead

- 11th career 54-hole lead/co-lead in individual stroke-play events on TOUR, the most of any player since he joined the TOUR at the start of the 2019-20 season (second-most: 8, Jon Rahm); 4-for-10 to date converting to victory
- Three 54-hole leads/co-leads in his last four starts (leads the PGA TOUR with three 54-hole leads/co-leads this season)

Scottie Scheffler – with a victory

- Would be his ninth PGA TOUR title and third of the season
- Would be his second major championship title in his 18th start in a major (88th man to win multiple majors), along with the 2022 Masters Tournament
- Would be the 18th player to win the Masters multiple times and first to accomplish the feat since Bubba Watson in 2014
- Would be the fourth-youngest player to win the Masters multiple times, behind Jack Nicklaus, Tiger Woods and Seve Ballesteros
- Would be the second player to win THE PLAYERS Championship and the Masters Tournament in the same season, joining Tiger Woods (2001)
- Would be the third player to win THE PLAYERS Championship and the Masters Tournament multiple times, joining Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods
- Would be the first player to win nine (or more) times on the PGA TOUR in the span of three seasons since Justin Thomas, won nine titles between 2016-17 and 2018-19
- Would be his second season with three or more wins on the PGA TOUR (4/2021-22, 3/2024)
- Would have multiple titles at four different PGA TOUR events (WM Phoenix Open in 2022 and 2023, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard in 2022 and 2024, THE PLAYERS Championship in 2023 and 2024, Masters Tournament in 2022 and 2024)

Collin Morikawa – with a victory

- Would be his seventh PGA TOUR title and first since the 2023 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- Would be his third major championship title in his 17th start in a major (48th man to win three or majors), along with the 2020 PGA Championship and 2021 Open Championship
- Would be the eighth player to win the Masters Tournament, PGA Championship and The Open Championship, joining Gene Sarazen, Sam Snead, Ben Hogan, Gary Player, Jack Nicklaus, Tiger Woods and Phil Mickelson
- Would enter the 2024 U.S. Open with a chance to complete the Career Grand Slam; five players have accomplished the feat: Sarazen, Hogan, Player, Nicklaus and Woods
- Would be the only player to win three or more majors since Morikawa turned professional in 2019

Miscellaneous Notes

- With a win, **Ludvig Åberg** (4th/-4) would become the third player since the inception of the Masters in 1934 to win a major in his first attempt, joining Ben Curtis (2003 Open Championship) and Keegan Bradley (2011 PGA Championship)
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and five-time Masters champion **Tiger Woods** cards a 10-over 82, his highest score in 99 rounds at the Masters; Woods now has seven scores of 80 or higher on TOUR and four in majors
