TOP STORYLINES

The Mexico Open at Vidanta is the first of two Full-Field Events leading up to the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard. The Aon Next 10 for the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard will be filled with the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings through the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches that did not finish in the top 50 of the 2022-23 FedExCup Playoffs and Eligibility Points List, while the Aon Swing 5 will be made up of the next five players earning the most points in the Mexico Open at Vidanta and the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches.

Only four players in the field at the Mexico Open at Vidanta have qualified for the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard: **Tony Finau, Emiliano Grillo, Mackenzie Hughes** and **Patrick Rodgers**. The winner of the Mexico Open at Vidanta will earn a spot in all five remaining Signature Events (if a non-member, must accept membership after the win), while other TOUR members are fighting for spots in the Aon Next 10 and the Aon Swing 5. Nos. 8-11 in the Aon Next 10 standings are all in the field: No. 8 **Thomas Detry**, No. 9 **Mark Hubbard**, No. 10 **Nicolai Højgaard** and No. 11 **Charley Hoffman**.

Tony Finau, the highest-ranked player in the field at No. 24 in the Official World Golf Ranking, is making his first of two starts this season as the defending champion (other: Texas Children's Houston Open). Finau, a seven-time PGA TOUR winner, has made three prior starts as the defending champion on TOUR, recording two top-10s. As part of the PGA TOUR's return to a calendar-year schedule, the Texas Children's Houston Open was moved from the fall portion of the season to March and will be played between the Valspar Championship and the Valero Texas Open this year.

26 players in the field have competed in both editions of the Mexico Open at Vidanta since its addition to the PGA TOUR schedule in 2022, including four that finished in the top 10 both years:

Brandon Wu has finished in the top three in both years the Mexico Open at Vidanta has been on the PGA TOUR schedule, earning a T2 in 2022 and a solo-third in 2023. Wu has made one start in a Signature Event this season, qualifying for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am via the "fill the field" category (T47), and is currently outside the top 20 in the Aon Next 10 standings.

There are eight players in the field from Mexico, including PGA TOUR rookie **Raul Pereda**, who earned PGA TOUR membership via his T4 at PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry (top-five finishers and ties received TOUR cards). He made 10 starts on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica in 2023 and earned four top-10s to finish No. 22 in the Totalplay Cup standings, granting him an exemption to Second Stage of Q-School A native of Cordoba, Veracruz, Mexico, Pereda received a sponsor exemption to the 2023 Mexico Open at Vidanta, his first career TOUR start. He sat T17 through three rounds following an opening 65 before a closing with a 76 to finish T60.

ADDITIONAL STORYLINES

The seven other players in the field from Mexico received sponsor exemptions. 2024 Latin America Amateur Championship winner **Santiago De La Fuente**, who is currently a senior at the University of Houston, qualified for three majors in 2024 with his victory at the Latin America Amateur Championship (Masters Tournament, U.S. Open, The Open Championship). De La Fuente became the second player from Mexico to win the event, joining **Alvaro Ortiz**, who made the cut at the 2019 Masters and finished one stroke behind Viktor Hovland for low amateur honors. Ortiz is making his third consecutive start at the Mexico Open at Vidanta (T42/2022, MC/2023). Both Ortiz (2021) and **Sebastian Vazquez** (2016) won the Mexico Open when it was sanctioned by PGA TOUR Latinoamérica. **Players from Mexico in the field**

The 10th hole at Vidanta Vallarta was the third-hardest par 4 on the PGA TOUR schedule in 2022-23 (second-hardest in non-majors) and the 17th hole was the fifth-hardest par 3 last season (third-hardest in non-majors). Vidanta Vallarta and Los Angeles Country Club, which hosted the 2023 U.S. Open, were the only two courses on the 2022-23 PGA TOUR Schedule that featured one of the top-five hardest par 3s and top-five hardest par 4s.

Eight players in the field competed at The Genesis Invitational last week, with **Tony Finau** (T19) earning the best result. Others who made the cut include **Mackenzie Hughes** (T31), **Nicolai Højgaard** (T39), **Emiliano Grillo** (T44) and **Charley Hoffman** (50th), while **Patrick Rodgers**, **Alex Smalley** and **J.J. Spaun** missed the cut. **Padraig Harrington** is the only other player in the field that competed in a PGA TOUR-sanctioned event last week, finishing T15 at the Chubb Classic, which was shortened to 36 holes due to weather.

PGA TOUR rookie **Alejandro Tosti** finished T10 at the Mexico Open at Vidanta last year after receiving the sponsor exemption designated for the player from Latin America that earned the most points in the three Latin American events on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2023. The top-10 earned him a spot in the following week's Wells Fargo Championship, where he finished T47. Tosti has made two cuts in three starts in his rookie campaign, with his best result coming at the Farmers Insurance Open (T43).
