### Erik van Rooyen (1st/-8)

- After celebrating his 34<sup>th</sup> birthday a day earlier, South African native mixes two eagles, five birdies and one bogey en route to a season-low 8-under 63, one stroke shy of his career-low 62 (three times/most recent: R4/2023 American Express)
- Aside from victories, this marks his first time with the lead/co-lead after any round on TOUR in individual stroke play events
- Seeks his third win on TOUR and second in Mexico after winning the 2023 World Wide Technology Championship in Los Cabos; first title was the 2021 Barracuda Championship
- Now has 17 of 18 rounds under par this season (72/R1/WM Phoenix Open)
- With eagles at Nos. 6 and 12, marks the first time with multiple eagles in any individual stroke play event on TOUR
- Makes second appearance at Vidanta; finished T33 in 2023 after opening with a 64 to sit T2 after round one

#### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- Beginning at No. 10, Finland native Sami Valimaki (2<sup>nd</sup>/-7) notches six birdies in his first 10 holes, plus an eagle 2 at the par-4 7<sup>th</sup> hole en route to 7-under 64, matching his career low on TOUR, a 64 in his most recent round (64/R4/2024 WM Phoenix Open); PGA TOUR rookie makes 11<sup>th</sup> start on TOUR; T24 at 2022 Genesis Scottish Open marks his lone top-25 in 10 prior starts
- David Lipsky (T3/-6) posts his first round in the 60s this season (10 rounds) and best score at Vidanta since final-round 64 in 2022 en route to T6; makes nine birdies, tying his career most in a single round (R2/2021 Fortinet Championship) on TOUR, including birdies on four of the five par-3 holes
- **Henrik Norlander** (T3/-6) began with a bogey at No. 1 and made the turn at 1-under before closing with a birdie-birdie-birdie-par-eagle finish in his first start this season and 163<sup>rd</sup> on TOUR while seeking his first TOUR win
- Cristobal Del Solar (T3/-6) makes second PGA TOUR start after earning a sponsor exemption to this event in 2023 (MC/68-74); made history posting the lowest 18-hole score in any PGA TOUR sanctioned event when he shot a first-round 57 (-13) at the 2024 Astara Golf Championship on the Korn Ferry Tour, eventually finishing fifth
- South Africa native MJ Daffue (T3/-6) makes 50<sup>th</sup> TOUR start and second appearance at the Mexico Open at Vidanta (MC/2023) after learning Sunday night that he was the recipient of a sponsor exemption when Will Zalatoris withdrew
- Cameron Champ and Patrick Rodgers are among a group of eight players at 5-under and T7; both are among four players in the field that finished inside the top 10 at the 2022 and 2023 Mexico Open at Vidanta: Champ (T6/T8), Rodgers (10<sup>th</sup>/T10), Tony Finau (T2/Won), Brandon Wu (T2/3<sup>rd</sup>)
- Robby Shelton (T15/-4) records the longest birdie streak of the season with seven in a row (Nos. 6-12); since the start of the 2022-23 season, there have been six birdie streaks of seven of more on the PGA TOUR, and Shelton is the only player on TOUR with two birdie streaks of 7+ in that span (other: 7/R3/2023 American Express)
- Alvaro Ortiz joins Latin America Amateur Championship winner Santiago De la Fuente at 4-under and T15 as the best of eight Mexican players in the field
- Defending champion Tony Finau (T29/-2) began on No. 10 and closed the round with birdie-double bogey-birdie
- University of San Francisco sophomore Renato Naula (T120/+4) becomes the first player from Ecuador to play on TOUR

• **Peter Malnati** (back) and **Philip Knowles** (eye) both withdrew before the first round and were replaced in the field by **Zecheng Dou** (T29/-2) and **Austin Smotherman** (T65/E), respectively
