Xander Schauffele - with the victory

- Earns his eighth PGA TOUR title in his 175th start at 30 years, 6 months, 24 days
- Wins first major championship title in his 28th major championship start
- Collects 750 FedExCup points to remain second in the FedExCup standings
- Began the week as the only player in the top five of the Official World Golf Ranking without a major championship; moves from No. 3 to No. 2 with the win
- PGA TOUR wins (8): 2017 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, 2017 TOUR Championship, 2018 WGC-HSBC Champions, 2019 Sentry, 2022 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Patrick Cantlay), 2022 Travelers Championship, 2022 Genesis Scottish Open, 2024 PGA Championship
- 263 sets new PGA Championship 72-hole scoring record (previous: 264/Brooks Koepka/2018)
- 21-under is the lowest score in relation to par in major championship history (previous was 20-under, five times: Jason Day/2015 PGA Championship, Henrik Stenson/2016 Open Championship, Dustin Johnson/2020 Masters Tournament, Cameron Smith/2022 Open Championship, Bryson DeChambeau/2024 PGA Championship)
- Previous best finish in the PGA Championship (T10/2020); previous best finish in any major (T2/2018 Open Championship, T2/2019 Masters Tournament)
- Claims first TOUR title since winning in back-to-back starts in 2022 (Travelers Championship, Genesis Scottish Open); 679 days since last win
- Has 20 top-10s since the start of the 2022-23 season, the second-most of any player in that span (27, Scottie Scheffler)
- Led the field in birdies (25) and Greens in Regulation (60 of 72)
- Posts four rounds under-par at a major championship for the first time in his career
- One of four players with top-10s in the first two major championships of the season (Scheffler, Morikawa, DeChambeau)

- Three of the last four major championships have been won by first-time major winners (Xander Schauffele/2024 PGA Championship, Brian Harman/2023 Open Championship, Wyndham Clark/2023 U.S. Open: Scottie Scheffler won the Masters Tournament in 2024 and 2022)
- Players with 12 top-10s in major championships before winning his first major championship, sixth-most:

Xander Schauffele – history with the 54-hole lead/co-lead

- Ninth career 54-hole lead/co-lead individual stroke-play events; 3-for-9 converting to victory
- Also held the third-round lead/co-lead at the Olympics in Tokyo where he won the gold medal, and with teammate Patrick Cantlay en route to winning the 2022 Zurich Classic of New Orleans

Miscellaneous Notes

- 2020 U.S. Open champion **Bryson DeChambeau** (2nd/-20) led the field in Driving Distance (330.5 yards); was seeking to become the 21st player to win the PGA Championship and the U.S. Open and first since Brooks Koepka in 2019
- **Viktor Hovland** (3rd/-18), who finished T2 in the 2023 PGA Championship, was attempting to become the first player since Jack Nicklaus (1975) to win the PGA Championship after a runner-up finish: posts four rounds under-par at a major championship for the first time in his career
- **Thomas Detry** (T4/-15) records his best finish in a major championship (eighth appearance)
- **Collin Morikawa** (71) and **Sahith Theegala** (73) were the only players in the top 30 on the leaderboard who failed to shoot under par in the final round
- The field this week was a combined 214-under par; in the last 40 years, this is the lowest score (in relation to par) in a single major championship (2022 Open Championship/-182)
- Two players, **Xander Schauffele** and **Shane Lowry**, tied the major championship 18-hole scoring record this week (62); chart below shows players with a 62 in the Modern Major Era and the time between each:
