Things to Know

- Upon conclusion of Final Stage of PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry which will see the field play two 18-hole rounds at both Dye's Valley Course at TPC Sawgrass and Sawgrass Country Club the top five finishers and ties will earn PGA TOUR membership for 2025.
- In addition to awarding PGA TOUR cards, PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry determines 2025 season eligibility for the Korn Ferry Tour and PGA TOUR Americas, with the following performance benefits available at Final Stage:
 - o **Top Five and Ties:** PGA TOUR membership for 2025
 - Next 40 Finishers and Ties: Exempt for multiple reshuffles of the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season
 - The first 25 finishers and ties in this category will be subject to the third reshuffle, assuring them starts in the first 12 events of the 2025 season
 - Any remaining finishers within the category will be subject to the second reshuffle, assuring them starts in the first eight events of the 2025 season
 - All remaining finishers outside of the aforementioned categories earn conditional status for the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season, in addition to being exempt through the Latin America Swing of the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas season

Field Notes (as of December 10, 2024)

- Kensei Hiarta, who earned an exemption to Final Stage as the leading player from the Japan Golf Tour Order of Merit, is the highest-ranked player in the field in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 114). Hirata, a sixtime winner on the Japan Golf Tour, turned 24 years old in November and notably finished T6 at the 2023 ZOZO Championship on the PGA TOUR. Hirata also earned a wire-to-wire victory at the 2023 Japan PGA Championship at age 22, which made him the youngest winner in the event's history.
- While the top 10 players from the 2024 Fortinet Cup standings upon conclusion of the inaugural PGA TOUR Americas season earned Final Stage exemptions, Johnny Keefer finished No. 1 and earned both a Final Stage exemption and fully exempt status for the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season. Keefer, who earned PGA TOUR Americas membership via a No. 25 finish in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking, can only improve his status this week by finishing in the top five and ties to earn PGA TOUR membership for 2025.
- The top five players from the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking earned exemptions to Final Stage, though
 No. 1 Michael Thorbjornsen is not in the field. Additionally, Austin Greaser and Matthew Riedel earned
 fully exempt status for the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season by virtue of finishing in the top three of the 2024
 PGA TOUR University Total Points List (combined FedExCup and Korn Ferry Tour points earned).

Seven additional players from the PGA TOUR University Class of 2024 qualified for Final Stage, though No. 8 Frederik Kjettrup, who earned fully exempt status for the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season by virtue of winning three times during the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas season to earn the Three-Victory Promotion, withdrew from this week's field. Additionally, No. 10 Karl Vilips is not in this week's field, as he earned PGA TOUR membership for the 2025 season with a top 30 finish on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List.

 finished No. 16 in the 2024 PGA TOUR University Ranking and played the majority of summer and fall on

 to oldest) Cameron Huss, Andi Xu, Nick Gabrelcik, Cole Sherwood, Drew Doyle, and Barend Botha.
