Things to Know

- Canadians and captain's picks Corey Conners and Taylor Pendrith are each 0-5-0
- U.S. wins all five matches in Round One (Four-ball), the fifth time in event history a team has swept a round
- The last time a team swept a round was the 2007 Presidents Cup, the only other time Royal Montreal hosted the event **Shutout Rounds**

Match 1: Xander Schauffele/Tony Finau (U.S.) def. Jason Day/Byeung Hun An (INT), 1-up

Match 2: Collin Morikawa/Sahith Theegala (U.S) def. Adam Scott/Min Woo Lee (INT), 1-up

Match 3: Scottie Scheffler/Russell Henley (U.S.) def. Sungjae Im/Tom Kim (INT), 3 and 2

Match 4: Wyndham Clark/Keegan Bradley (U.S.) def. Taylor Pendrith/Christiaan Bezuidenhout (INT), 1-up

Match 5: Patrick Cantlay/Sam Burns (U.S.) def. Hideki Matsuyama/Corey Conners (INT), 2 and 1

Match 1: Xander Schauffele/Tony Finau (U.S.) def. Jason Day/Byeung Hun An (INT), 1-up

• In his first Presidents Cup match not paired with Patrick Cantlay, Xander Schauffele (and partner Tony Finau) win the first point of the 2024 Presidents Cup; Schauffele earned the clinching point in the U.S. victory at the 2022 Presidents Cup

Updated Presidents Cup records

Match 2: Collin Morikawa/Sahith Theegala (U.S) def. Adam Scott/Min Woo Lee (INT), 1-up

- First match for rookie Sahith Theegala and first Four-ball match for Collin Morikawa at the Presidents Cup
- 50th match played by Adam Scott (second-most in Presidents Cup history; most: 55, Phil Mickelson)
- 26th match lost by Adam Scott (most in Presidents Cup history)
- 20th Four-ball match played by Adam Scott (second-most in Presidents Cup history; most: 21, Phil Mickelson)
- 11th Four-ball match lost by Adam Scott (most in Presidents Cup history)

Match 3: Scottie Scheffler/Russell Henley (U.S.) def. Sungjae Im/Tom Kim (INT), 3 and 2

- First match World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler has won in any format at the Presidents Cup (went 0-3-1 in his debut in 2022)
- Rookie Russell Henley wins in his first career Presidents Cup match
- Scheffler and Henley were the only team to be at least 1-up after each hole for the duration of their match

Match 4: Wyndham Clark/Keegan Bradley (U.S.) def. Taylor Pendrith/Christiaan Bezuidenhout (INT), 1-up

- 2025 Ryder Cup captain Keegan Bradley is making his second Presidents Cup appearance (2013)
- Canada's Taylor Pendrith has yet to win at least a half point in his fifth career Presidents Cup match
- One of four players to go undefeated (including ties) at the 2022 Presidents Cup, South Africa's Christiaan Bezuidenhout loses his first career match

Match 5: Patrick Cantlay/Sam Burns (U.S.) def. Hideki Matsuyama/Corey Conners (INT), 2 and 1

- First time Patrick Cantlay was not paired with Xander Schauffele in a Presidents Cup match
- First match Sam Burns has won in any format at the Presidents Cup (went 0-3-2 in his debut in 2022)
- Japan's Hideki Matsuyama and Canada's Corey Conners each miss putts to extend match to 18
 - Conners misses 16-foot, 3-inch putt
 - o Matsuyama misses 12-foot putt

Miscellaneous notes

All matches are worth one point, for a total of 30 points. There are no playoffs, with each side receiving a half point if a match is tied after 18 holes. In a change inspired by the events of the 2003 Presidents Cup, if the match is deadlocked at the end of Singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share the Presidents Cup.
