Things to Know

• A day after the U.S. Team won all five Four-ball matches, the International Team wins all five Foursome matches, the first time in Presidents Cup history with multiple session sweeps

Second time the International Team has swept a session and first since 2003

- First time Internationals have won a Foursomes session since 2005: Round One, 3.5 (INT) 2.5 (U.S.), Robert Trent Jones
- The International Team wins three matches by at least a five-hole margin, the first time in Presidents Cup history a team has won more than two matches by at least a five-hole margin in either a Four-ball or Foursomes session
- Hideki Matsuyama and Sungjae Im (INT) defeat Patrick Cantlay and Xander Schauffele (U.S.), 7 and 6, tying the largest margin of victory in Presidents Cup history

- Hideki Matsuyama and Sungjae Im (INT) defeat Patrick Cantlay and Xander Schauffele (U.S.), 7 and 6, tying the largest margin of victory in Presidents Cup history
- Matsuyama/Im close out match with seven straight birdies
- First career Foursomes loss for Cantlay and Schauffele at the Presidents Cup
- 19th match to end in 13 or fewer holes and first since 2022 when Schauffele and Cantlay defeated Adam Scott and Matsuyama, 6 and 5, in Thursday Foursomes
- Eighth time Cantlay and Schauffele have played together in a Presidents Cup match, tied for most in history (8, Fred Couples/Davis Love III, U.S.)

Match 7: Adam Scott/Taylor Pendrith (INT) def. Sahith Theegala/Collin Morikawa (U.S.), 5 and 4

- 51st match played by Adam Scott (second-most in Presidents Cup history; most: 55, Phil Mickelson)
- 19th match won by Adam Scott (second-most by an International player; most: 20, Ernie Els)
- 21st Foursomes match played by Adam Scott (second-most in Presidents Cup history; most: 22, Phil Mickelson)
- 9th Foursomes match won by Adam Scott (most by an International player and third-most by any player; most: 12, Tiger Woods, U.S., Phil Mickelson, U.S.)
- 22 career points by Adam Scott, the most by an International player (next: 21, Ernie Els)
- First career point for Pendrith who failed to record at least a half point in 2022 debut and lost Thursday Four-ball match

- One of two matches to go to 18 holes (other: Si Woo Kim/Byeong Hun An def. Scottie Scheffler/Russell Henley, 1-up)
- First match for Max Homa and rookie Brian Harman who each sat in Thursday's Four-ball session
- Max Homa, who went undefeated in his only other Presidents Cup appearance (2022, 4-0-0), loses his first career match

• Canadians and captain's picks Corey Conners and Mackenzie Hughes win their first career Presidents Cup match in first time being paired together; Hughes is making his debut, while Conners failed to record at least a half point in 2022 debut

Miscellaneous notes

All matches are worth one point, for a total of 30 points. There are no playoffs, with each side receiving a half point if a match is tied after 18 holes. In a change inspired by the events of the 2003 Presidents Cup, if the match is deadlocked at the end of Singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share the Presidents Cup.
