TOUR season notes

Napa, California

- The 2024 Procore Championship marks the first year with Procore as title sponsor and is the first of the FedExCup Fall, a group of eight tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2025 PGA TOUR Season.
- Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive the same benefits of winners of Full-Field Events during the Regular Season, including 500 FedExCup points, Official World Golf Ranking points, a two-year PGA TOUR exemption (exempt thru 2026) and invitations to The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship.
- Although players in the top 50 are not earning FedExCup points, their points are not redistributed; for example, if Max Homa (No. 6) finishes solo-second and Mackenzie Hughes (No. 51) finishes solo-third, Hughes receives the usual 190 points for third place, not the 300 points for second place.
- The Aon Next 10 is an eligibility pathway to earn access into Signature Events (outside of The Sentry), recognizing the top 10 players, not otherwise exempt, from the FedExCup standings. Nos. 51-60 in the final FedExCup Fall standings at the conclusion of The RSM Classic will serve as The Aon Next 10 for the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational. FedExCup Fall winner Ludvig Åberg entered the 2024 season as part of the Aon Next 10 and finished runner-up at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am to solidify his spot in the Aon Next 10 for all Signature Events in 2024.

Procore Championship notes

- 2023 Procore Championship winner Sahith Theegala was among five of the 2023 FedExCup Fall winners to qualify for the 2024 FedExCup Playoffs (others: Tom Kim/Shriners Children's Open, Collin Morikawa/ZOZO Championship, Erik van Rooyen/World Wide Technology Championship, Ludvig Åberg/The RSM Classic), and among three to advance to the TOUR Championship (Theegala, Morikawa, Åberg)
- Four players in the field have won a tournament this season: **Wyndham Clark** (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am), **Nick Taylor** (WM Phoenix Open), **Jhonattan Vegas** (3M Open), **Chris Gotterup** (Myrtle Beach Classic)
- The field includes:
 - Three players competed at 2024 TOUR Championship: Sahith Theegala (3rd), Wyndham Clark (8th), Tom Hoge (T29)
 - Seven past champions: Mike Weir (2007), Sangmoon Bae (2014), Kevin Tway (2018), Cameron Champ (2019),
 Stewart Cink (2020), Max Homa (2021,2022), Sahith Theegala (2023)
 - 65 PGA TOUR winners, led by nine-time winners Matt Kuchar and Brandt Snedeker
 - Seven major champions (most recent: Wyndham Clark/2023 U.S. Open)

Top player notes

- Following the Procore Championship, the FedExCup Fall will take a two-week hiatus, during which the 15th Presidents Cup (Sept. 23-29) will be contested at The Royal Montreal Golf Club in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. A number of captains and players will be in Napa, including International Team Captain Mike Weir and Captain's Assistant Camilo Villegas, alongside team members Corey Conners (Canada), Mackenzie Hughes (Canada) and Min Woo Lee (Australia). U.S. Team Captain Jim Furyk is not in the field, but will be on-site throughout the week as two of his captain's assistants (Stewart Cink/winner of 2020 Procore Championship, Kevin Kisner) and three U.S. team members (Wyndham Clark, Max Homa, Sahith Theegala).
- Defending champion **Sahith Theegala** captured his first PGA TOUR title in 2023, becoming the fourth winner by a California native at the event in the last five years, joining Cameron Champ and Max Homa. World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler is the only player to defend his title on TOUR this season (THE PLAYERS Championship).
- World No. 6 **Wyndham Clark**, the highest-ranked player in the field, will make his sixth start at the event (best: T30/2021). Clark has made 16 eagles this season, which is tied for the most eagles made in 2024 (other: Sam Burns).
- Two-time Procore Championship winner **Max Homa** (2021, 2022) seeks to become the first three-time winner of the event (other multiple winner of the event: 2/Brendan Steele).

- Sponsor exemption and World No. 1 amateur **Luke Clanton** has three top-10 finishes in six starts on TOUR (T2/John Deere Classic, 5th/Wyndham Championship, T10/Rocket Mortgage Classic). Clanton has earned 14 points and needs six more points before the spring college golf season concludes to earn TOUR membership via PGA TOUR University Accelerated.
- PGA TOUR Americas season-long points leader **John Keefer** will make his PGA TOUR debut having notched the top spot with a T3 finish on Sunday at TPC Toronto at Osprey Valley.
