Patton Kizzire (1st/-18)

- Seeks third career PGA TOUR win in his 242nd start and first since the 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii
- Would end a winless drought of 6 years, 8 months, 1 day (176 starts)
- Four strokes ties the largest 54-hole lead in tournament history (Sangmoon Bae/2014/won)
- All seven players with a 54-hole lead of four strokes or more have gone on to win on TOUR this season (most recent: Scottie Scheffler/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday)
- Fourth 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR starts; 1-for-3 to date (2017 World Wide Technology Championship/won)
- Win on Sunday would come at 38 years, 6 months, 12 days
- Enters the week No. 132 in the FedExCup standings and is currently projected No. 70
- Has two top-10 finishes in 18 starts this season: Barracuda Championship (T8), Myrtle Beach Classic (T10)
- Making eighth start at the Procore Championship, with a runner-up finish in his first start in 2016 his lone top-10 finish

Miscellaneous Notes

- First-round leader **David Lipsky** (2nd/-14) seeks first career PGA TOUR title in his 105th career start; six players have made the Procore Championship their maiden TOUR victory (most recent: Sahith Theegala/2023)
- Canadians and International Presidents Cup team members Mackenzie Hughes and Corey Conners sit at T3 at 13-under 203; last international winner at the Procore Championship was Emiliano Grillo (Argentina) in 2015
- PGA TOUR rookie **Patrick Fishburn** (T3/-13) would be the fourth rookie to win on TOUR this season (fifth total win), joining Nick Dunlap (2), Matthieu Pavon and Jake Knapp
- In his first title defense, **Sahith Theegala** (T7/-12) trails by six in bid to become the third player to win the Procore Championship in back-to-back seasons since the event moved to Silverado Resort in 2014 (Brendan Steele/2016-17, Max Homa/2021-22)

FedExCup Fall Notes

- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2025 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
 - O Currently no players are projected to move into Nos. 51-60
- The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn full Korn Ferry Tour status and conditional status on TOUR
 - Currently projected to move into the Top 125: Patton Kizzire (1st; from No. 132 to No. 70), David Lipsky (2nd; from No. 163 to No. 102), Greyson Sigg (T3; from No. 130 to No. 108)
 - Currently projected to fall out of the Top 125: Vince Whaley (MC; from No. 121 to No. 127), Hayden Springer (MC; from No. 124 to No. 128), Sam Ryder (MC; from No. 125 to No. 130)
