Patton Kizzire (Winner/-20)

- Earns his third career PGA TOUR win in his 242nd start at the age of 38 years, 6 months, 12 days
- PGA TOUR wins (3): 2017 World Wide Technology Championship, 2018 Sony Open in Hawaii, 2024 Procore Championship
- Snaps a winless drought of 6 years, 8 months, 1 day (176 starts)
- Moves from No. 132 to No. 70 in the FedExCup Fall standings
- Five strokes marks the largest winning margin in tournament history: previous largest margin was two strokes (five occasions and most recently by Sahith Theegala in 2023)
- Marks the largest margin of victory on TOUR since Davis Riley won the 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge by five shots over Keegan Bradley and Scottie Scheffler
- All eight players with a 54-hole lead of four or more strokes this season have gone on to win
- Improves to 2-for-4 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead (2017 World Wide Technology Championship, 2024 Procore Championship)
- Picks up his third top-10 finish of the season; the others – Barracuda Championship (T8), Myrtle Beach Classic (T10)
- Wins in eighth start at the Procore Championship, with a runner-up finish in his first start in 2016 his previous-best finish

Miscellaneous Notes

- **David Lipsky** finishes a career-best runner-up for the first time in 105 starts; with the annual RSM Birdies Fore Love competition beginning this week and running through The RSM Classic, wins this week’s competition with 26 birdies (or better)
- **Patrick Fishburn** finishes in solo-third place for the second time in his last four starts (Barracuda Championship)
- **Ben Silverman** picks up his third top-10 finish in 85 starts (T4/2024 Procore Championship, T7/2017 Sanderson Farms Championship, T8/2017 RSM Classic)
- **Greyson Sigg** finishes a career-best T4 in his 97th TOUR start (previous-best finish: T7/2022 3M Open); snaps a streak of six straight missed cuts
- **Sahith Theegala** finishes T7 in bid to become the third player to win the Procore Championship in back-to-back seasons since the event moved to Silverado Resort in 2014 (Brendan Steele/2016-17, Max Homa/2021-22); marks his career-best ninth top-10 finish of the season

FedExCup Fall Notes

- Nos. 1-50 in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions, while Nos. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points into the Fall; Nos. 51-60 through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2025 (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, The Genesis Invitational)
 - No players moved into Nos. 51-60 this week

- The Top 125 will be exempt into all Full-Field events and THE PLAYERS next season and Nos. 126-150 will earn full Korn Ferry Tour status and conditional status on TOUR
 - Three players moved into the Top 125 this week: **Patton Kizzire** (1st; from No. 132 to No. 70), **David Lipsky** (2nd; from No. 163 to No. 101), **Greyson Sigg** (T4; from No. 130 to No. 112)
 - Three players fell out of the Top 125: **Vince Whaley** (MC; from No. 121 to No. 126), **Hayden Springer** (MC; from No. 124 to No. 127), **Sam Ryder** (MC; from No. 125 to No. 128)
